Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your brother, the late Private Charles T. Brommer, who was reported killed in action overseas, during the World War.

You are advised that the remains of an Unknown Soldier now buried in Grave 1, Row 11, Block G, of the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Meuse, France, have been identified as those of your brother. The Unknown Soldier interred in the above mentioned grave died on November 14, 1918, in American Red Cross Hospital #114, at Fleury-sur-Aire, Meuse, France, from a gun shot wound in the head. This soldier had formerly been in a Field Hospital and when transfer was made to the American Red Cross Hospital #114, his identity was lost. Immediately after death, therefore, finger prints were taken and notation made of physical characteristics and other important data which might aid in identification. The finger prints referred to were positively identified by The Adjutant General as belonging to your brother, the late Private Charles T. Brommer, who was reported severely wounded in action on November 8th or 9th, 1918, and admitted to Field Hospital #354, with a gun shot wound in the head. Two rings taken from the remains identified as those of your brother, are enclosed herewith.

A beautiful white marble cross, inscribed with the name of your brother, his rank, organization, date of death and the State from which he came, will be erected at his grave. The Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, wherein the remains of your brother are interred, is one of the most beautiful of the permanent American Cemeteries in Europe. It has been laid out

1. Unknown U. S. Soldier U-3533, interred in Grave 1, Row 11, Block G, of the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, has been identified as the late Private Charles T. Brommer, Serial #2205775, 89th Division, 355th Infantry, Headquarters Company.
2. Identification was made from finger prints taken immediately after the death of this Unknown Soldier on November 14, 1918, in the American Red Cross Hospital #114, then at Fleury-sur-Aire, Meuse, France. It is directed that the necessary adjustments be made in all your records.

3. A permanent headstone with the following inscription will be placed at the grave of this soldier:

In the transfers unfortunately his ~~identification~~ identity was lost, and he was admitted to American Red Cross Hospital #114 as Unknown U.S. soldier, G.S.W. multiple. Died at R.C. 

1. The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, provides pilgrimages to be made to the cemeteries of Europe by the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who lost their lives between April 5, 1917 and July 1, 1921, and whose remains were lost at sea or are interred in the cemeteries of Europe.

2. This office has made an earnest endeavor to locate the mothers and widows who are eligible under the law to make the pilgrimage. However, every effort to locate the mother or widow of the deceased service man from Missouri whose name appears on the enclosed sheet has been unsuccessful.

MEMORANDUM FOR COLONEL LAUBACH:

It is entirely possible that U-3533 and Charles T. Brommer are one and the same. On the other hand certain discrepancies appear which cannot be reconciled - i. e. dental chart, color of eyes, recorded height and estimated height.

Aside from the question of discrepancies appearing, it would not be inappropriate to bear in mind that this office has been unsuccessful in its efforts to locate the present whereabouts of the mother or other relatives of the deceased veteran.

For the reasons indicated it is recommended that the matter be left as is.

Memorandum for Colonel Laubach.

1. There is interred in Grave No. 1, Row 11, Block G, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, unknown American soldier U-3533. This soldier died on November 15, 1918 at the R. C. H. Hospital No. 114 at Fleury-sur-Aire, France, and was buried in Grave 78, Plot 2, Section K, of the American Cemetery at that place by a chaplain. This soldier was reported to have a gunshot wound in the head and the chaplain who made burial, in view of the fact that his identity was unknown, had fingerprints taken and advised that this man was 62 inches in height, had brown hair, hazel gray eyes, weight approximately 125 pounds, was 25 years old, had a mole on the chest 2 inches below the right armpit.

2. The fingerprints taken on this soldier were sent to The Adjutant General with request that an effort be made to identify the soldier to whom the fingerprints belong. After a thorough investigation, The Adjutant General advised this office that the fingerprints of the unknown soldier, U-3533, were identical with one Charles Thomas Brommer, Serial Number 2205775, who was inducted into the military service February 25, 1918, assigned to the 164th Depot Brigade, transferred to Headquarters Company, 355th Infantry, sailed for overseas June 4, 1918 and was reported severely wounded in action November 8-9, 1918, and admitted to Field Hospital #354, A.E.F., with gun shot wound, head, severe. The outline figure card of this man shows that he was white; height 65 inches; age 29 years and 11 months, and the following is his personal description: eyes, blue; hair, light; complexion, fair; scars: nose, right shin two scars, left shin, left calf of leg; moles, right buttocks, back of neck. Size of uniform shoe, 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ D.

3. A check of the records indicates that soldiers admitted to Field Hospital # 354 were later evacuated to Field Hospital # 339 and subsequently evacuated to R.C.H. Hospital No. 114.

4. In view of the foregoing facts, it is the opinion of the undersigned that unknown U. S. soldier U-3533 is Charles T. Brommer and confirmation of this identity is recommended.


