Pvt. Roy Brown got wounded with shrapnel on a section of the Chateau Thierry front, near the Bois de Roi on July 23, 1918. His left leg was torn nearly all to pieces; and his right foot also. Pvt. George W. Davis and I carried him immediately to the dressing station. He later died in an evacuation Hospital.

" I think Roy Brown was a wagoner. He was wounded some time in July, going through a heavy barrage. At that time we were brigaded with the 6th French Army. He was lying in a field, near Noroy, way this side of Chateau Thierry, when he had both legs shot off. A corporal was wounded at the same time.

They were carried in the ambulance by four German prisoners and the corporal told us that Brown died on the way to the hospital. Letters kept coming to the company for some time afterwards. He often spoke of his mother who lived in Los Angeles. He was one of the first boys to get hurt. He was an awfully good fellow. He and I chummed together a great deal. We never had any trouble all the while he was in the outfit. The last thing he said before he went across was "Well, boys I hope I get four or five of those Germans before they get me"; but they got him first. I would like very much to know the address of his mother, and I would write to her, or go and see her if it were a possible thing, when I get back to the USA."

Check in the amount of \$2.18 drawn on the Treasury of the United States is enclosed herewith.

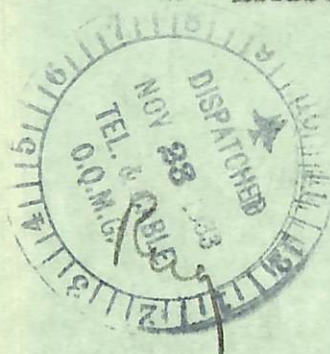

<p><b>FILLINGS</b>.....Draw filling on tooth accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus :</p>	
<p><b>CARIES (CAVITIES)</b>.....Outline location and size of cavity, shade in thus :</p>	
<p><b>DENTURES (PLATES)</b>.....Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."</p>

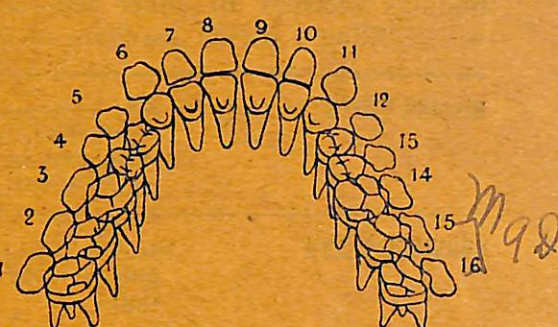
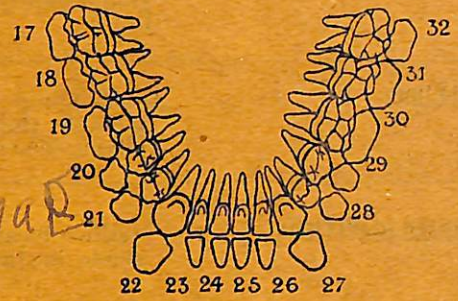


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

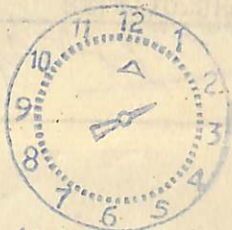

There's a brave old boy. He was a wonderful soldier up in the lines. He would give anything to help another man. It was in the Chateau Thierry drive the morning of July 22nd or 23rd. We had been occupied and busy, starting to chase Jerry with our trucks. Had just had breakfast, - the first in three days. That night we picked a position for the guns and dug in. We were wakened about 1:30 A.M., breakfasted, advanced, and shelled quite a bit and gassed, but went about a mile and a half when we came under severe shell and machine gun fire both. Roy was caught in the legs by machine gun bullets. The same time the Battalion got hold of 6 German prisoners Roy's wounds were dressed. He was conscious, - he didn't realize how badly he was hurt. We decided to send the prisoners back also. Two stretcher bearers ~~were~~ were with Roy. He said, "No, give me my gun." (his 45) He insisted upon taking the 6 prisoners back himself, made them carry him, - 4 men carried his stretcher, two marched ahead. He covered them all with his gun, had no assistance. I saw him going back. He reported them all to the dressing station. He was sent to a hospital. Several days later when we were relieved Major Sibert went to see him, - they told him there was no chance for Roy. We all thought he had died. Reports came later to the company. He certainly deserved a D.S.C.
