


3. FINAL GRAVE LOCATION **ug. 8, 1922 31 21 Block C 4**

On the night of October 9, 1918, at Tresevaux, St. Mihiel Salient, France, while being relieved by B Battery of the 114th F.A., we were bombarded by the Germans with gas almost entirely. The bombardment started at 10.30 P.M. and finished at 5.30 A.M. October 10th. Pvt. Brown was evacuated in the early morning of October 10th.


INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.


