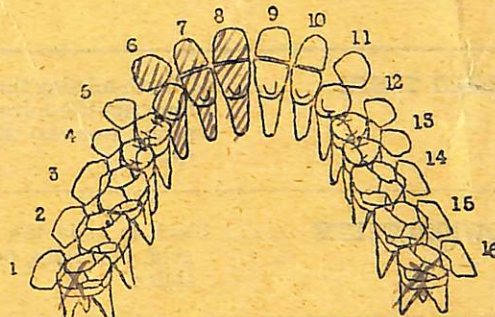
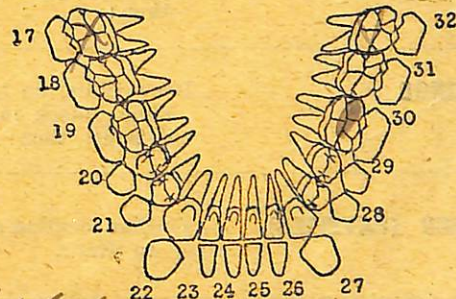

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the corresponding numbered space. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26 Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
