Your attention is invited to the enclosed copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, entitled an Act "To enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries".

The records of this office show that you are the brother of the late Nicola Bua, Co. M, 309th Inf., whose remains are now interred in the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Meuse, France.

Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Both mothers and widows are entitled to make the pilgrimage.


Your attention is particularly invited to Section 4 of the enclosed Act, which defines the terms "mother" and "widow". If the relative is a stepmother, mother through adoption, or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the decedent, a statement as to her relationship is requested. If he was survived by a widow who has since remarried it is also requested that a statement to that effect be made.



Dear Sir:

The Quartermaster General desires that receipt be acknowledged of your kind letter of February 23rd, 1924, inclosing a letter dated November 28th, 1921, from the European Office.

It is regretted to have to inform you that the Department cannot, at this late date, favorably consider your request for the shipment of your gallant son's body to Italy, at Government expense. The Secretary of War has ruled that no original requests for the disposition of our soldier dead would be accepted after April 1st, 1921, owing to the progress of the work in France.

The records show that the Chief, American Graves Registration Service, Q. M. C., in Europe, endeavored to secure your wishes as to the final disposition of the body of your son, the late Private Nicola Bua, Company M, 309th Infantry, in 1921; but no replies were received from you regarding the matter. In this connection your attention is invited to the inclosed copy of letter of January 17th, 1922.

Please know that if you desire the shipment of the body to you at private expense, the Department will consent to this action. In this event, kindly address a letter to the Chief, American Graves Registration Service, Q. M. C., in Europe, 20 Rue Molitor, Paris, (16eme) France. He will render such assistance as is possible towards expediting the removal of the body to Italy, without involving any expense to the Government.

M. 309th, Infantry, Serial No. 1750246, who died on the field of honor while serving with the American Expeditionary Forces in France, I am writing you today begging you to be kind enough to furnish me with all possible information in order to secure the remains of my late son Nicola.

As you will readily ^{see} from the enclosed letter received from your European Branch sometime in 1921, my son was buried in Permanent Cemetery No. 1232, Section 21, at Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Meuse, France,

For your information I will say that my son lived in this community until he emigrated to the United States when a young boy, and as I am now very very old, it is my fervid wish to have the remains of my son in the cemetery of this village.

I have been unable to trace the Certificate to which the sixth paragraph of your letter is referring.

Dear Sir:

On August 16 and October 5, 1921, this office communicated with you, requesting a statement as to your wishes regarding the final disposition of the remains of your son, Pvt. Nicola BUA, #1750246, Co. M, 309th Inf., who is now buried in PERMANENT Cemetery #1232, Section 21, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Meuse, France. No reply has been received therefrom.

Do you wish his body to remain buried in said Permanent American Cemetery in France, or removed therefrom and buried in a National Cemetery in the United States? In either decision the U.S. Government bears all expenses incurred.

However, should you prefer the remains for private interment, the U.S. Government will DELIVER same free of expense, provided the health regulations and sanitary laws permit the entry into Italy; and provided further that the deceased was, at some time during his life, a resident of the town, city, or neighborhood in which you now live.


If the deceased never resided in your community, then this Service will transport the remains to the place where he actually did reside in Italy.

All expenses covering burial, tombstones, and future care of the grave and cemetery are to be paid by you.

In the event it is desired that the remains be shipped to you for private interment, the attached Certificate should be filled out, signed and sworn to by you, as the next of kin, in the presence of an official of your Commune who has authority to administer oaths; also it must be signed and sealed by said official. The legally-executed Certificate should then be returned to this Service.

If you wish to express your desires in any way, write them clearly on the bottom of this letter and return same to us.

1. The permanent grave of this soldier is No. 30, Row 41, Block E, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery at Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France.

2. This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization and date of soldier's death. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

3. In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open


