The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, authorizes pilgrimages to the cemeteries Of Europe during the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933 for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe.

Your attention is particularly invited to the fact that this is the last opportunity you will have to make the pilgrimage under the provisions of the above mentioned Act. Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.



Reference is made to previous correspondence relative to the pilgrimage of mothers and widows to the cemeteries of Europe, authorized by the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929.

The records show that in June 1930 you stated that because of failing health you could not make a pilgrimage to the grave of your son, the late Private first class Stanley F. Bugala. In the event your health has improved, it is believed you should feel no hesitancy in making the journey as competent personnel will be provided to care for the mothers and widows from the time of their arrival in New York City until their return thereto. Medical attendants, nurses, and all other necessities will be arranged for and you are assured that everything possible will be done for your comfort and welfare. During the summers of 1930 and 1931 many mothers of advanced age and in poor health made the pilgrimage and appeared to have benefited therefrom.

In view of the foregoing, it is possible you may change your mind and desire to make a pilgrimage during 1932. If so, it is requested you advise this office as promptly as possible in order that proper arrangements may be made for you. In the absence of a reply from you, your name will be placed upon the list of mothers and widows who are eligible to make the trip in 1933.



Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of October 21, 1929, relative to the pilgrimage authorized by Congress in the Act of March 2, 1929.

In reply to your inquiry as to whether Mrs. Bugala would be permitted to have her daughter accompany her on this pilgrimage, paying the extra cost, you are advised that the War Department has been charged with the execution of this Act, and its efforts, therefore, must be restricted to making the arrangements necessary for the transportation, entertainment, etc. of those named as eligible under the Act. Any arrangements which a daughter of Mrs. Bugala desires made to visit the grave of her late brother, Private Stanley F. Bugala, must be made by her personally.

Mrs. Bugala will be advised the name and sailing date of the vessel far enough in advance, it is believed, to permit her daughter to communicate with the steamship company relative to securing accommodations for herself.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open
