Willard Bonham, Sgt. Co. M 363 Inf., made following statement on 4 cases of unlocated men of his organization: Alva E. Diver, Edward R. Smith, George Bulaich and Orlindo Giunchi-

" Informant was an eye witness at the time of death by rifle bullet on Oct. 31 1918. Death was instantaneous and body was buried near Paarden Kauter, Belgium. Informant knows men by christian name and initial."

Investigator sent this data to Europe with other information for physical search for these men since they should have been buried together and Europe interviewed a resident of Paardenkuter who made following report:

"A small detachmen of thirteen American soldiers arrived at his home and asked him if there were any germans about and where they were, he at the time being under cover for protection from rifle fire. These soldiers immediately afterward stepped out to attack germans. The next day he found 5 Americans dead and many more Germans. Several days later he, his son and a neighbor were ordered to perform the burials; first he buried one American in a separate grave, two others together in one grave in a trench in which he buried a number of Germans, the latter being side by side and the other two Americans at the end of the trench lengthwise feet towards the Germans, space between about one meter. Many months later the Americans came to exhume the five Americans for concentration at Waereghem"

These graves were again exhumed and nothing found.

Unknown records however show that 4 unknowns 2817,2818,2819 came from exactly the same place and 2820 a very short distance from the others. These were exhumed by the same officer on same day and reburied on the same day.

ALL FOUND TO HAVE BEEN BURIED ONLY " IN O.D. SHIRTS" It was apparent therefore that the Germans must have removed all clothing and tags etc.

These 4 unknowns are being identified as the 4 men in question and each considered specifically on opinion sheet.

The 5th man mentioned by the Frenchman has not been identified as yet and the comrade will be consulted for information thereon.

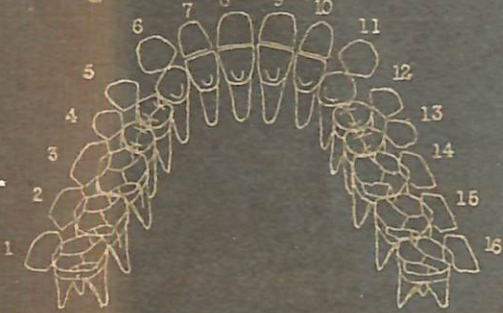
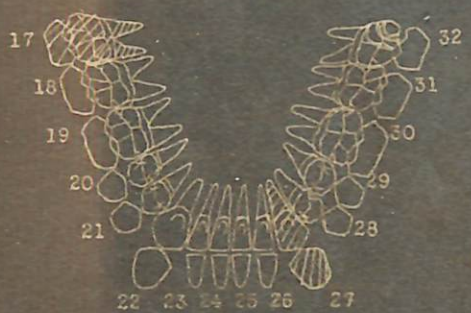
