Reference is made to previous correspondence relative to the pilgrimage of mothers and widows to the cemeteries of Europe, authorized by the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929.

The records show that in March 1930 you stated your health would not permit you to make a pilgrimage to the grave of your son, the late Sergeant Leon Bullard. In the event your health has improved, it is believed you should feel no hesitancy in making the journey as competent personnel will be provided to care for the mothers and widows from the time of their arrival in New York City until their return thereto. Medical attendants, nurses, and all other necessities will be arranged for and you are assured that everything possible will be done for your comfort and welfare. During the summers of 1930 and 1931 many mothers of advanced age and in poor health made the pilgrimage and appeared to have benefited therefrom.

In view of the foregoing, it is possible you may change your mind and desire to make a pilgrimage during 1932. If so, it is requested you advise this office as promptly as possible in order that proper arrangements may be made for you. In the absence of a reply from you, your name will be placed upon the list of mothers and widows who are eligible to make the trip in 1933.

In the event your health has improved, it is believed you should feel no hesitancy in making the journey as competent personnel will be provided to care for the mothers and widows from the time of their arrival in New York City until their return thereto. Medical attendants, nurses, and all other necessities will be arranged for and you are assured that everything possible will be done for your comfort and welfare. During the summers of 1930 and 1931 many mothers of advanced age and in poor health made the pilgrimage and appeared to have benefited therefrom.

In view of the foregoing, it is possible you may change your mind and desire to make a pilgrimage during 1932. If so, it is requested you advise this office as promptly as possible in order that proper arrangements may be made for you. In the absence of a reply from you, your name will be added to the list of mothers and widows who are eligible to make the trip in 1933.




Referring to your request that the remains of the deceased soldier named above be left undisturbed, you are advised that your request may be complied with providing you assume all future responsibilities and care in connection with the up-keep of the grave and will fill in and return the affidavit enclosed releasing the United States Government from all responsibilities.

2. Permanent American cemeteries have been established in France and England to which all bodies to be left in these countries will be transferred, excepting the ones for which the relatives assume responsibility for the up-keep of the grave. All graves in these permanent American cemeteries will be carefully and tenderly maintained by our Government as fitting memorials of the sacrifices of the late soldiers.

3. Unless telegraphic reply at Government expense is received from you by Oct 15 1921 stating you will sign and return immediately the enclosed Form 123, releasing the Government from further responsibility, it will be assumed that you desire the Government to continue to care for the grave of the deceased named above and his remains will be transferred to one of the permanent American cemeteries. If this is done, you will be furnished the new grave location as soon as possible after the transfer is made.
