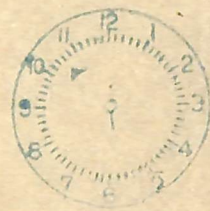

Your attention is invited to the enclosed copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, entitled an Act "To enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries".

The records of this office show that you are the father of the late **Second Lieutenant Richard S. Bullitt, Co.K, 110th Inf. whose remains are now interred in the Oise-Aisne American Cemetery, Seringes-et-Nesles, France.**

Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Both mothers and widows are entitled to make the pilgrimage.

Your attention is particularly invited to Section 4 of the enclosed Act, which defines the terms "mother" and "widow". If the relative is a stepmother, mother through adoption or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the decedent, a statement as to her relationship is requested. If he was survived by a widow who has since remarried it is also requested that a statement to that effect be made.

When I was in France in March of 1920 I placed on the grave of my brother, Lieut. Richard S. Bullitt at the Cemetery of Seringes, a small marble wreath of roses which I was assured, by the caretakers, and also the officer in charge, stationed then at Soissons, could and would remain there.

By a photograph just received I am distressed to find that this wreath has been removed. I request that you ascertain for me the reason of its removal, and also where it has been put. I spent several days at Fere-en-Tardencis, and also visited other cemeteries while in France, so that I know the regulations that are in force, as to monuments & decorations of graves. My wreath was a most inconspicuous one. I enclose a photograph, which I took myself when I placed it there.

It would be to be regretted if our Government were to deny us so small a favor, as to be permitted to place so small a remembrance on the grave of one who gave all to his country.

I will greatly appreciate your investigating the matter for me and I ask as evidence that a photograph be taken, with the wreath in its place.

This seems but a trifling matter but it gives one a feeling of insecurity as to the care that our heroes are receiving at the hands of our Government and I feel responsible toward those whom I was able to comfort by telling them what provisions were made for the care of our dead.

Will you also kindly tell me if those who were left in the cemetery at Seringes will remain where they are, or if they are to be removed again?

When choosing that my brother's body was to remain in France, it was with the understanding that his body would be allowed to remain in peace - having been twice reburied since the date of his death on the battle field.

I have always found the Graves Registration most courteous and prompt in answering any inquiries and I trust this letter will receive the same attention.

I was Lt. Bullett's individual runner, and he was killed by a machine gun bullet right in front of me. It was at Château-Thierry, just after we had crossed the Ourcq river, on Hill 220. It was after we had gone over the top in an attack, and the Germans had fired on us and we had dropped and were lying on the ground. I had just brought up a message and handed it to the lieutenant, and I saw his helmet fly up. He was shot right through the head and he never made a move - died instantly. I called over to our platoon sergeant, Sgt. Austin Dillie, and said: "The Lieutenant has got it," and a minute after that I got hit in the right shoulder myself and commenced to crawl back to the rear.

I heard another fellow say afterwards in the hospital - it was Corporal Howard Lucky, of the same company - that he had heard that that same night, they crawled out and took Lt. Bullett's personal effects and buried him. I couldn't say that that was true, but he told me he had heard it on pretty good authority. Lucky went to our College, Waynesburg College, but wasn't from our town.

Lt. Bullett was a mighty fine fellow and we all thought the world and all of him. I was his individual runner and stayed with him all the time. Sometimes when he was busy, I would dig a hole big enough for us both to lie in, and sometimes he would dig the hole for us both. It's not often you find an officer who treats his men as good as he did. He was such a dandy fellow. When his platoon was out of cigarettes he would buy them for

them out of his own pocket. There wasn't a man in the platoon who wouldn't have done anything for him - that's how much we thought of him. Lt Bullett's mother is dead. His father is an old man, living in Philadelphia. He is a millionaire. If I get a chance to stop in Philadelphia when I go back I will see him and tell him all about it.

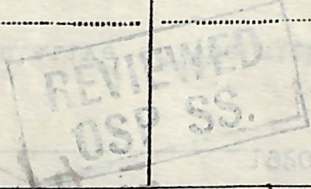

In reply to your letter of recent date, addressed to the late Colonel Charles C. Pierce, you are advised that the Chief, American Graves Registration Service, Q.M.C. in Europe, has been directed to institute an investigation to determine the present location of the wreath which was placed on the grave of your brother, the late 2nd Lieutenant Richard S. Bullitt, Company "K", 110th Infantry, the reason for its removal and if it can be located to replace same on the grave.

It is impracticable to comply with your request that you be furnished with a photograph of the grave with the wreath placed thereon as the American Red Cross have discontinued this work and *this department* of their office in France is now closed and there are no facilities now available for this purpose. However, upon receipt of report of the investigation from the Chief of operations in Europe, you will be advised.

You are further advised that the American Cemetery at Seringes-et-Nesles, Department of Aisne, has been designated for permanent retention in France and will be known as the "American Cemetery of the Oise-Aisne." The graves of officers and soldiers interred therein will be perpetually cared for by the United States Government.

My dear Mr. Bullitt:

Inquiry has been made with regard to the grave location of 2d Lieut. Richard S. Bullitt, 110th Infantry, who was killed in action July 29th, 1918. An error has been discovered in the spelling of the name, and I am now able to advise you that the body of this officer has been recently transferred from its original location in Clerges, Department of Aisne, to the American Battle Area Cemetery, at Seringes-et-Nesles, Department of Aisne; Grave #6, Section J, Plot #1.

This removal was effected in pursuance of the policy of concentration in which the forces of Great Britain, France and the United States have for some months been commonly engaged. The object has been to group together, in well selected places, isolated bodies and those originally interred in smaller groups where proper maintenance was not practicable.

I hope that the giving of this more definite information may be of some comfort to you, and I beg to assure you of my sympathy.

I might add that we have recently transmitted to this city from my office in France a carload of papers and records pertaining to mortuary affairs with a view to working out to completion a mass of details upon which the necessary letters of notification were dependent.
