Your attention is invited to the enclosed copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, entitled an Act "To enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries".

The records of this office show that you are the father of the late Private William W. Bunker, Company H, 162nd Infantry, whose remains are now interred in the Somme American Cemetery, Bony, Aisne, France.

Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Both mothers and widows are entitled to make the pilgrimage.

Your attention is particularly invited to Section 4 of the enclosed Act, which defines the terms "mother" and "widow". If the relative is a stepmother, mother through adoption, or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the decedent, a statement as to her relationship is requested. If he was survived by a widow who has since remarried it is also requested that a statement to that effect be made.

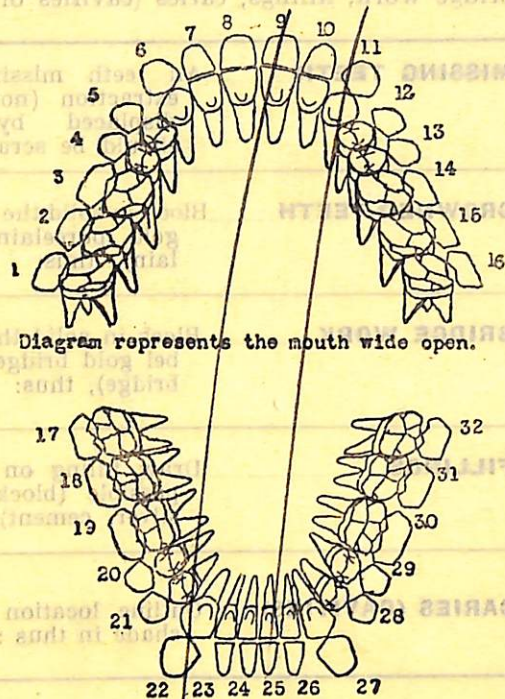








**INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A**

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting « Yes » or « No ».
- (b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.

<p><b>MISSING TEETH</b> ..... All teeth missing through previous extraction (not those fractured or displaced by recent wounds) should be scratched out, thus:</p>	
<p><b>CROWNED TEETH</b> ..... Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold, porcelain, or gold and porcelain), thus:</p>	
<p><b>BRIDGE WORK</b> ..... Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold bridge, gold and porcelain bridge), thus:</p>	
<p><b>FILLINGS</b> ..... Draw filling on tooth accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus:</p>	
<p><b>CARIES (CAVITIES)</b> ..... Outline location and size of cavity, shade in thus:</p>	
<p><b>DENTURES (PLATES)</b> ..... Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word « clasp ».</p>

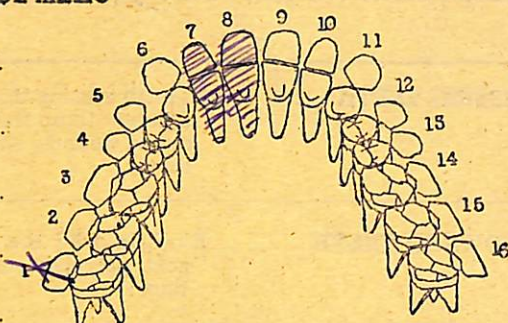
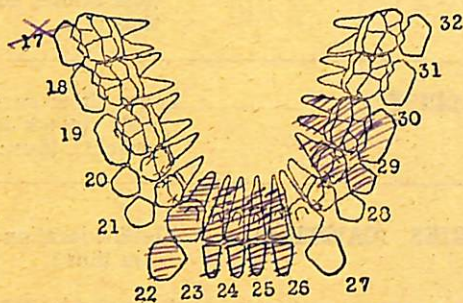

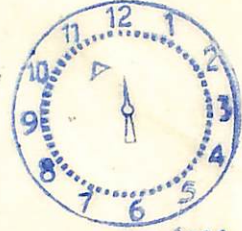

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AUTHORITIES OF THE FRENCH REPUBLIC,  
LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

We are here to-day, in this silent encampment of the dead, in a dual capacity — primarily, as the representatives of the absent relatives — parents, wives, children, brothers and sisters — of the Americans who sleep here in the friendly soil of the Nation whom they crossed the sea to aid; and, secondly, we are here to pay our tribute of honor to noble men and women — soldiers and sailors, as well as members of all the auxiliary services of the American Expeditionary Force — who have sacrificed their lives in the great cause that brought them to France.

In our representative capacity we stand in telepathic sympathy with the sorrowing next-of-kin across the sea, who are scattered from Maine to California and from Florida to Washington, throughout the domain of the great Republic. We feel the throbbing of their hearts and their concentrated thoughts focused to-day on the city of Havre, where the light of their homes went out forever. May the knowledge that we are here to take their places be a comfort to them and assuage the grief that not even time can obliterate!

We are assembled to honor the memories of these heroic dead — heroic by virtue of the cause they served and the sacrifice they made to win the Peace that now reigns throughout this noble land. We stand in communion with the spirits of these American soldiers and they in turn are in communion with that host of their comrades of the French Army who laid down their lives in the same titanic struggle, and in communion with the dead martial heroes of the time of Napoleon, as well as of every other period in the long and glorious history of France.

On this consecrated ground, at this solemn moment, we instinctively pass in mental review the last experiences on earth of these men whose memory we honor. What great impulse summoned them to arms from their peaceful pursuits in a far-away land, where prosperity and happiness reigned? What great motive impelled them to break asunder the loving ties of family and home, to condense long years of joyous life into a few weeks of hardship and suffering, and to die on the threshold, in the springtime of life, in the full vigor and bloom of youth? It was the Liberty of the World and the Honor of the American Nation; the promptings of exalted patriotism, and the imperious dictates of resolute conscience.

In mental vision we perceive again these young men as they parted forever from their aged mothers and fathers, brothers and sisters, and some from youthful wives and infant children, and hastened to the great camps where a multitude of civilians was fashioned, with feverish activity, into an army capable of meeting on terms of equality the most formidable war organization that the world has ever seen. We follow them as they entrained for the ports of the United States, and as they marched aboard the waiting transports, and were conveyed across the submarine-infested ocean. Again we see them as they landed on the soil of France and hastened to the battle-front and we follow them upon the field of glory and the clash with the enemy, and then sadly we return with them to the military hospitals of Havre, where we see them on beds of anguish and perceive the Angel of Death hovering over them.

There are in this assembly several ladies who sat beside the death-beds of these young heroes who lie here before us and heard their eager stories of what they saw on the battle-front and their last recollections of those they left in the Homeland. The presence of these ladies in those last moments created for the dying soldiers the illusion of the far-away home which they were destined never again to see. If each silent tenant of this assembly of the dead could arise and tell us his last experiences on earth at the battle-front, on the hospital train back to Havre, and on his bed of pain what an epic of suffering and moral courage would be presented by their contribution to the final Victory. Many of those who lie buried here struggled so hard to reach the Front, but were denied that privilege

because they fell ill and died in military hospital. They, too, did well their part in the Great War, and they also deserve to be crowned with the laurels of valor.

Give them the meed they have won in the past ;  
Give them the honors their merits forecast ;  
Give them the chaplets they won in the strife ;  
Give them the laurels they lost with their lives.

So far as my mental vision can pierce the veil of future years, I feel sure that, at each recurring Memorial Day, the American Colony of Havre, accompanied by the sympathetic citizens of this community, will come to this spot to repeat its tributes of honor to the memories of the Americans who laid down their lives in the Great War. But this is the last time there will be so many graves in this plot, for before another year rolls around the remains of many of those lying here will be removed to the United States, in accordance with the expressed wishes of the families and the arrangements made by the United States Government to carry out those wishes. But doubtless there will always be some American graves in this plot to be decorated, because in some instances the families in the United States feel that, although France is distant on the map, it is yet very close to the heart of the American Nation, by virtue of the fraternal sympathy and basic affinity existing between the two Nations.

In the conviction that the city of Havre will always have the guardianship of a considerable number of graves of American soldiers, it is my intention to recommend to my Government that a Monument be erected on this spot to the memory of this group of our Heroic Dead. In the words of an American battle poet :

Rest on, embalmed and sainted dead,  
Dear as the blood ye gave,  
No impious footsteps here shall tread  
The herbage of your grave ;  
Nor shall your glory be forgot  
While Fame her record keeps,  
Or Honor points the hallowed spot  
Where Valor proudly sleeps.
