Private Burghardt was killed about 11:30 A. M., Nov. 1, just before the 2nd Batt. passed the lines of the 3rd Bn. of this Regt., and just south of the Bois de Barricourt, Dept. de Meuse, France. He died instantly, being struck by a large shell fragment squarely in the head. Pvt. Burghardt was at that time orderly for Major J. L. Peatross, 353rd Infantry. He was one of the most faithful fellows I ever saw.
