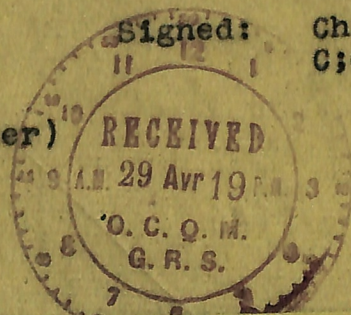
Pvt Burlison was wounded by a machine gun bullet during our advance over hill 180, near Cornay, on the morning of October 7th, 1918. Sgt Murray had given him first aid when I saw him and the sgt told me that "Burlinson was wounded beyond hope, that when he first reached him he said "I am hit" and did not say anything else." The wound was in the lower part of his chest. He lived for over an hour and died about 9,0'clock. He is buried on the fill just a few hundred meters from where he was killed between the crest of Hill 180 and the Aire River. Sgt James P Murray was wounded while aiding Pvt Burlinson.

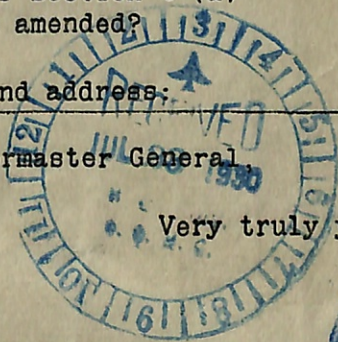

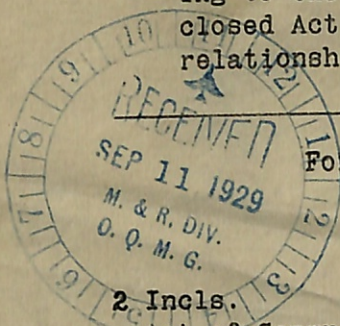

The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of **Private 1st class Arthur E. Burlinson, Company D, 327th Infantry is Grave 23, Row 21, Block B, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery at Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France.**

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

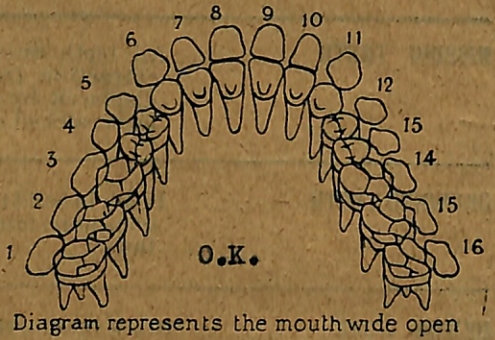
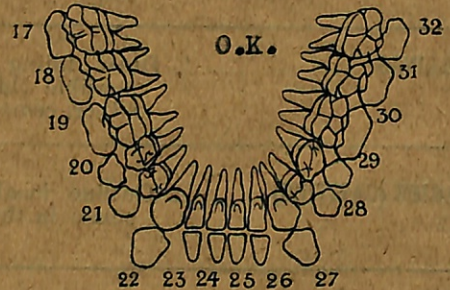


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

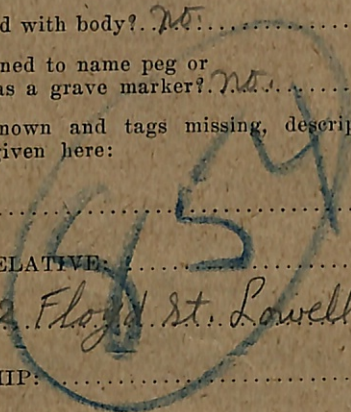
