June 21st - the SS PRESIDENT HARDING arrived at Cherbourg harbor at 7:30 a.m. in charge of Captain Ward H. Maris FA as Liaison Officer. Upon your return from Europe, it will therefore be necessary for you to remain in the hotel over night as a guest of the United States Government.

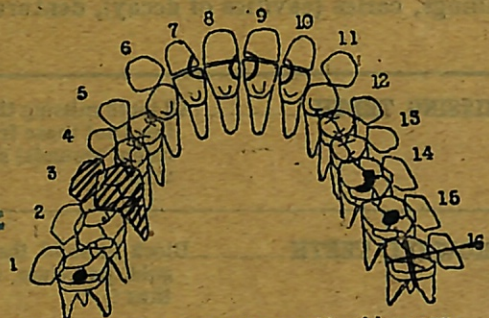


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

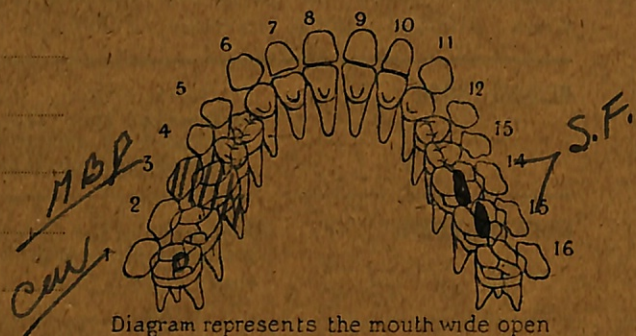
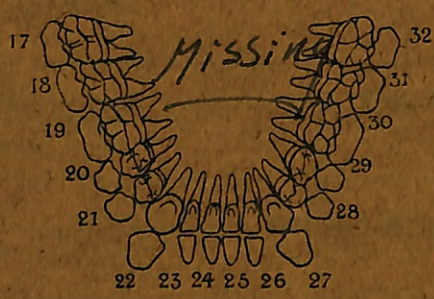
