

Subject: Disposition of the remains of 1st Cl. Sergeant Cleon L. Bart, Co. B, 316th Engrs. died Oct. 2/18, and request that they be shipped to above address.

1. This office is in receipt of your letter of the present month, relative to the above subject.

2. In reply I regret to say that it is impossible to state, at this time, when the remains of American soldiers buried abroad will be returned to the United States, but it will not be until after the promulgation of the treaty of peace and the appropriation asked of Congress, for this purpose, becomes available.

3. Upon their arrival in the United States the remains will be shipped to their respective homes at Government expense, by the proper authorities at the port of disembarkation, who will be duly instructed in this particular.

Subject: Shipment home of the remains of Sgt. Cleon L. Burt.

1. This office is in receipt of your letter of the 13th ultimo, requesting shipment to you at the above address, of the remains of your son, deceased.
2. In reply I regret to inform you that it will be impracticable to comply with your request immediately in view of the difficulties of transportation in France and overseas.
3. You are advised, however, that whenever it is found to be practicable to ship the remains home in accordance with your request, it will be done. If your address as indicated above is not correct, or you should desire that your request for shipment home of the remains be canceled, this office should be advised accordingly.
4. Under existing regulations the necessary steps are being taken by the military authorities in France to mark the grave of each soldier who has died or been killed in battle, and to register the number and location of the grave so as to establish beyond a doubt their identity when it becomes practicable to disinter the remains for removal to the United States.
5. The report of place of burial of your son has not yet been reported to this office.
6. It is suggested that you communicate with the Chief of the Effects Bureau, Hoboken, N. J., in regard to the personal effects of this soldier.
7. It is requested that you furnish this office the company and regiment to which your son belonged so that proper shipping instructions may be given.

Receipt is acknowledged of your communication of recent date advising that you are unable to make a pilgrimage to the grave of your son, the late Sergeant first class Cleon L. Burt, during the summer of 1933.

The pilgrimage was authorized by Congress in an endeavor to assuage to some extent the great loss sustained by the mothers and widows whose loved ones made the supreme sacrifice for their country during the late war, and it would seem from the many letters received from women who have made the journey that this effort has not been in vain. It is believed that you too would derive great consolation from visiting the last resting place of your son.

All expenses of the pilgrimage, including meals, tips, transportation by water, rail, taxi and bus, as well as incidental expenses, such as laundry are borne by the Government. Mothers and widows making the journey will need money only for the purchase of articles of a personal nature, such as souvenirs. There is no provision of law, however, which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow in lieu of the pilgrimage.

In the event you later reconsider and desire to visit the grave of your son next summer, it is requested you notify this office, and arrangements will be made for you.
