It is deeply regretted that Mrs. Busch was not spared long enough to visit the grave of her son in the Oise-Aisne American Cemetery in France, and sincerest sympathy is extended you in your bereavement. Your kindness in notifying this office of her decease is appreciated.

With reference to your desire to make the pilgrimage in her place, you are advised that the Act of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, provides for pilgrimages to Europe by the mothers and widows of deceased veterans of the American forces who were lost at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe, and contains no provision whereby the privilege of making the journey may be transferred to a relative in the event the mother or widow is unable to make the pilgrimage.
