My dear Mr. Vaile:

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of May 26, 1926. In reply, please be advised that it is impossible at this time to state when the permanent crosses will be erected in the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, where the son of Mr. Bushnell, is buried. Before the erection of crosses can be undertaken in this cemetery, it will be necessary that an additional appropriation of \$632,485. 42, included in the estimates for the fiscal year 1928, for permanent markers overseas, shall become available.

Judging from the rates of delivery on bids for 14,186 overseas grave markers, opened on May 14, 1926, it may be as much as two years after the appropriation becomes available, before the work of placing markers in this cemetery can be completed.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.







1. Replying to your letter of the 19th instant I have to advise that the records of this office show 2nd Lieutenant Theodore K. Bushnell, Co. B, 2nd Machine Gun Battalion, originally buried in Grave #35, Row 3, French Military Cemetery, Fleury-sur-Aire, Meuse, disinterred and reburied June 20, 1919 in Grave #132, Section 55, Plot 3, Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Meuse.

2. The article appearing in the Literary Digest and previously published in the New York Tribune was cabled to the Commanding General in France for remark. It is replied briefly that our cemeteries are new and the ground has not had time to settle due to lack of rains. Anybody desiring to criticise their appearance can do so if they compare them with long established cemeteries at home, but they can not criticise with justice if they consider length of time they have been established and the conditions under which they were created. Most of our cemeteries are in the battle areas where living conditions are almost impossible and labor exceedingly scarce due to reconstruction in that part of the country.

3. You may rest assured that the cemeteries give a very creditable appearance and every effort is being made to beautify them. Provision has been made for their future maintenance. If you desire to change your decision as to the disposition of the remains of your son, kindly notify this office.


