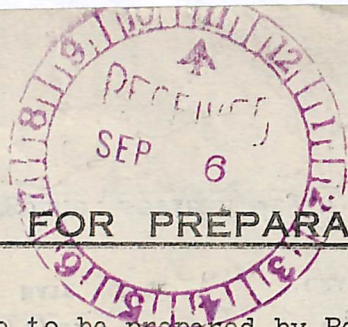

About 5,30 o'clock on the morning of October 4th, 1918 the Germans were shelling Septsarges woods. I was lying on the ground between Wagoner Raymond V. Wheeldon and Wagoner Stanley Butvilowich when suddenly Wagoner Wheeldon cried out that he was hit, I asked him where but did not get up at once, he said that ~~he~~ he was hit in the leg and that it was numb, I reached in my pocket to get a box of matches and it was still quite dark, after getting the matches I placed my right hand on the ground in order to bring myself to a sitting position, in doing so I felt something warm and wet I struck a match and examined Wagoner Butvilowich and finding him unconscious I went to the nearest 1st aid Station and brought back a Medical Corps Man who dressed his wound Wagoner Butvilowich died while his wounds were being dressed he had been mortally wounded in the head.

He was buried in Bois de Septsarges Woods.

**DENTURES (PLATES)**..... Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."
