

You are numbered among those who are privileged to make this pilgrimage.


During July and September of this year, inquiries were addressed to you as to whether or not you desire to make the pilgrimage to Europe. To these inquiries no reply has been received from you.



Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of April 26, 1930, relative to the pilgrimage authorized by Congress in the Act approved March 2, 1929.

It has been held that Section 1 of the Act above mentioned limits the pilgrimages to be made by only the mothers and widows of the deceased members of the American military or naval forces whose remains are interred in the cemeteries of Europe.

There is no provision of law which would permit of the transfer of the privilege of making this pilgrimage in the event a mother or widow is deceased or does not desire to make the pilgrimage.

It has been held that Section 1 of the Act above mentioned limits the pilgrimages to be made by only the mothers and widows of the deceased members of the American military or naval forces whose remains are interred in the cemeteries of Europe.

There is no provision of law which would permit of the transfer of the privilege of making this pilgrimage in the event a mother or widow is deceased or does not desire to make the pilgrimage.





