I was present when Buzzell got killed. Early in the morning of Oct. 21st the Germans sent over a heavy bombardment. Buzzell, in the performance of his duty, was rescuing some horses under heavy fire when he was struck with a fragment from a shell. He lived for several hours after he was struck. I knew Buzzell well. He was a good friend of mine, he never complained at hardships, always ready and willing to do his share, and he deserves great credit for his heroism under shell-fire. He was a brave soldier. In his death I lost a good friend.

The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of **the late Private Harry I. Buzzell, Battery D, 321st Field Artillery, is Grave 4, Row 16, Block B, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France.**

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

Dear Sir,

In reply to your undated letter, I beg to inform you that the photographs of graves in France are being automatically distributed to nearest relatives as recorded in the War Department.

It is impossible to hasten the distribution of these photographs as they are handled in the order in which they are received from France. I may inform you, however, that 95% of the graves have now been photographed. There is some little congestion in the laboratory in France, owing to the abnormal number of photographs being turned in, but the latest information is to the effect that these will all be handled and despatched within a week or two. All expenses in connection with this work are borne by the American Red Cross


