My dear Mr. Martin:

I am in receipt of your letter of February 10th, relative to the desire of Mrs. John F. McCarthy to make a pilgrimage to the grave of her brother, the late Corporal John F. Byrnes, in the Meuse Argonne American Cemetery in France.

The Act of March 2, 1929, authorizing the pilgrimage, provides only for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces interred in the cemeteries of Europe, to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government. No provision is made in the Act for any other member of the family to make the pilgrimage or for the transfer of the privilege of making the journey to the next-of-kin in the event the mother or widow is deceased.

In view of the foregoing, I regret to advise that Mrs. McCarthy is ineligible under the law to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.

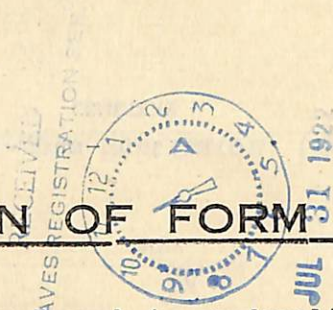

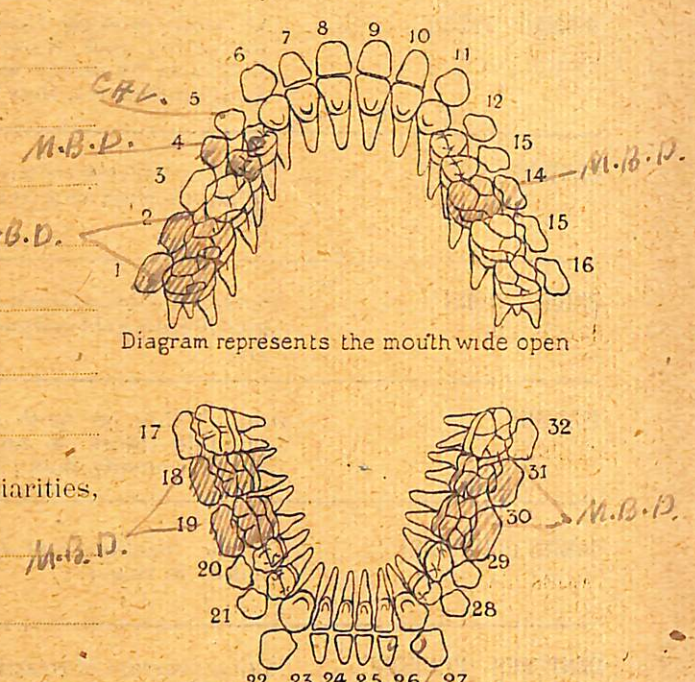
