About noon, on Nov 1st 1918, the battery was preparing a position in the vicinity of Cunel. Caesar had just finished clearing the line of fire for our guns by sawing a limb from a tree and walked a few paces from the tree when a shell from the enemy exploded close by, wounding him severely in the side and leg. First aid was immediately administered and 10 or 15 minutes after first aid arrived he died while being conveyed to the aid station. He was buried just about where he fell.
