Died of wounds October 23, 1918.

About 3 o'clock on the morning of October 21 Pvt. Cain was detailed as a runner to report to Company HQ. While on his way there he was struck by a piece of shrapnel, wounding him severely in the left leg and side. As our company was advancing, he was wrapped in a blanket and placed by a large tree to await the stretcher bearers. This was the last time he was seen by any members of this company.

This happened in Bantheville Woods.





The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of Private John Cain, Company E, 355th Infantry, is Grave 20, Row 21, Block B, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagnous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.



Mr. J. A. Cain, father of the above named soldier, has asked that we write you relative to the final disposition of his remains.

It seems that some month or six weeks ago, in answer to your circular request, he indicated his desire that the body be returned to this place for final interment. Since that time, however, he has recalled that the letter referred to the body of "Bugler John Cain," and in this connection, he recalls that frequently while his son was in the service, his mail was confused with that of a Bugler John Cain, whose home was in Mississippi. We do not have the serial number of Pvt. John Cain, but I can give you enough of his service record to identify him.


He enlisted in Co. C, 1st La. Infantry, which later became Co. C. 156th Infantry, and was subsequently transferred to Co. I, 156th Inf., with which organization he went over seas. He was later transferred, I believe, to a unit of the Second Division and was killed in action in the Meuse-Argonne. The first four figures of his army serial number I know were "1597", but the last three figures I do not know.

Mr. Cain is having me write you for two reasons: First, because he is afraid that he may cause some injustice to the parents of Bugler John Cain, by reason of the fact that he has expressed a preference as to the disposition of that soldier's remains, and because there may be some confusion as to the two bodies; and, secondly, because he has since decided that he would prefer to have the body of his son, Pvt. John Cain, remain permanently interred in France, instead of being returned to this place.

Of course, if orders have already been started in execution for the




