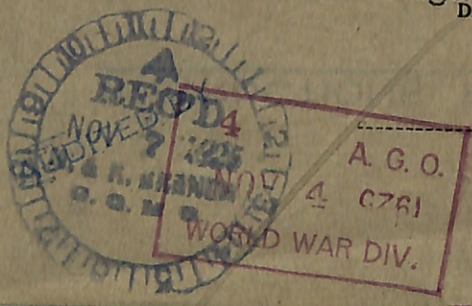

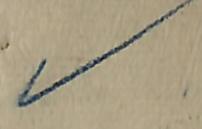

The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, authorizes pilgrimages to the cemeteries of Europe during the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933 for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe.

Your attention is particularly invited to the fact that this is the last opportunity you will have to make the pilgrimage under the provisions of the above mentioned Act. Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.

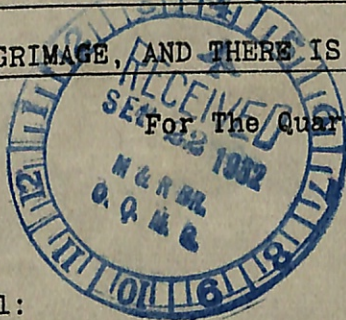

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of recent date advising that you do not care to make a pilgrimage to Europe to visit the grave of your son, the late Private Walter Calvin, in the St. Mihiel American Cemetery in France.

There is no provision of the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, which would permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow in lieu of the pilgrimage, even in the case where the mother is unable to make the journey.

This pilgrimage was authorized by Congress in an endeavor to bring comfort and solace to the mothers and widows whose sons and husbands lost their lives during the World War, and it is hoped that the opportunity to see the results of the efforts being made to beautify the last resting places of the men who gave their lives for their country will result in at least partially reconciling the mothers and widows to their sacrifice and loss.
