Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.



2. According to the present plans of concentration, bodies interred in this cemetery whose nearest of kin desire permanent retention abroad will be transferred to the American Cemetery of Meuse-Argonne in order that they may be under the care and custody of this Government. When the new grave location of your son is released, you will be duly advised.

3. This office is unable to furnish you a photograph of the above named cemetery; however, it is stated photographs of practically every place in Europe of interest in connection with the World War were taken by the Signal Corps of the United States Army and catalogues of these pictures containing necessary instructions relative to procuring them from the Signal Corps will be found in Public Libraries.




