Dear Madam:

In reply to your letter of the 9th instant, the Quartermaster General desires you to be advised that the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery at Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France, has been entirely rearranged according to plans formulated by a commission who visited the permanent cemeteries in Europe and made recommendations for their arrangement and ornamentation.

The number of disinterments for return to the United States necessitated a rearrangement of burials and in this connection the width between the new graves was made six feet. All this work was done with a view to making more fitting, the permanent burial place of our comrades whose bodies are to remain overseas, and was conducted with due reverence and under the direction of officers some of whom had been comrades-in-arms with the men whose final burial they were supervising.

As previously reported, the new grave number assigned to the case of your son is Grave 19, Row 36, Block F, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France.
