

Sailed May 29, 1931 on S. S. AMERICAN FARMER. Colonel B. O. Davis in charge, assisted by Miss H. N. Forrest as Hostess and Miss M. E. Williams, Nurse. Arrived Cherbourg 12.20 pm June 7th. Tender arrived 12.40 pm, bearing Colonel R. T. Ellis and five other officers; 3 nurses and 3 civilian employees. Tender returned to dock at 1.40 pm. Train left at 3.45 pm. Arrived Gare des Invalides 9.55 pm. Met by Executive Officer, members of office staff, nurses and runners. Also met at the station by the entire orchestra of the Ambassador Theatre in Paris. Upon your arrival in New York City, you will be met at the railroad station by an Army Officer who will be in uniform. During your sojourn in New York before sailing for Europe, and upon your return from Europe, you will stop at the Y. W. C. A., 175 W. 137th Street, New York City.

All mail intended to reach you between May 29th, 1931, the day you sail from the United States, and June 20th, 1931, the day you leave Europe, should be addressed to you in care of American Pilgrimage, 146 Avenue des Champs Elysees, Paris, France; for example:

In making reservations for your journey home from New York City, it is necessary for this office to furnish the railroads with the exact time and date of your departure. The party you are to travel with will be disbanded in New York City on the day following your return from Europe and all arrangements for your accomodations will be made with the railroads by this office accordingly. Upon your return from Europe, it will therefore be necessary for you to remain in the hotel over night as a guest of the United States Government.

There is also enclosed herewith information relative to the cemeteries in Europe.
