It is noted you state that Della McCollum, step-sister of your son, the late Private William D. Campbell, desires the privilege of visiting his grave in the St. Mihiel American Cemetery in France. In this connection you are advised that the only condition under which she would be eligible to make this pilgrimage would be by qualifying under the provisions of Section 4(a) of the Act which states in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces".

It has been held that within the meaning of the law a person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult unless such adult is mentally or physically incapacitated. No man who was mentally or physically incapacitated was accepted for service in the military or naval forces. Inasmuch as Private William D. Campbell, Company E, 371st Infantry was an adult at the time of the commencement of his service, his age having been 24 years, 8 months, no person could have stood in loco parentis to him for the year prior to his entry into the service. Therefore, I regret to advise that Della McCollum is ineligible within the meaning of the law to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

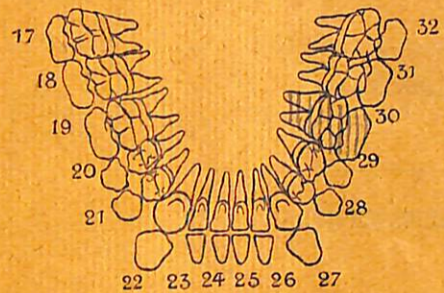
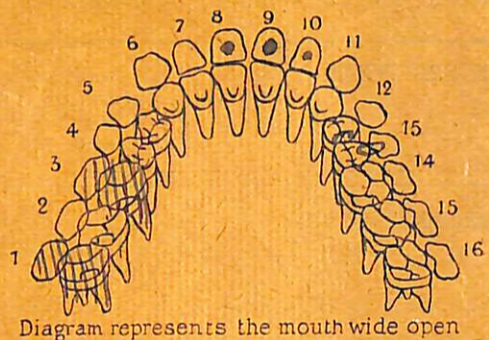
