CANARY, James H. - 2nd. Lieut.

Lieut. Canary of this Company was killed on Hill 253 near Gesnes, France, about the 9th. of October 1918. He was hit above the knee by a bullet from a machine gun and subsequently bled to death. Before he was buried, Lieut. Jennings (then Sgt.) took Lt. Canary's personal effects from his body (consisting of a watch, a pocketbook and a girl's picture) and gave them to the Co. Commander, Lt. Weine. Lt. himself was wounded the next morning, and died in the hospital a short time later.

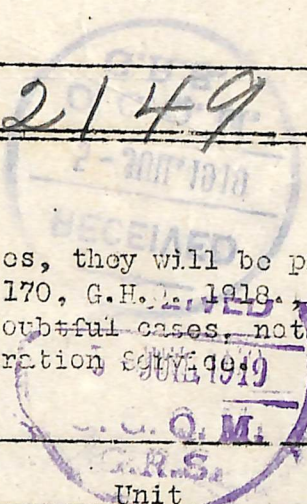

Dear Sir:

The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of the late James Harry Canary, 2nd Lt., Co. H, 125th Infantry, is Grave 16, Row 42, Block C, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

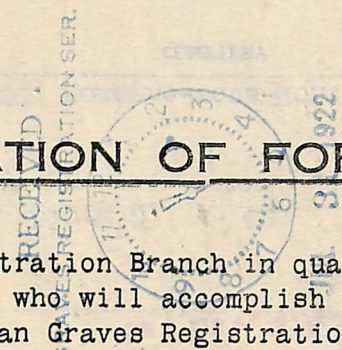

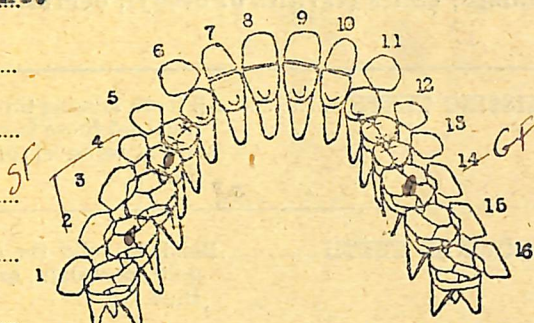
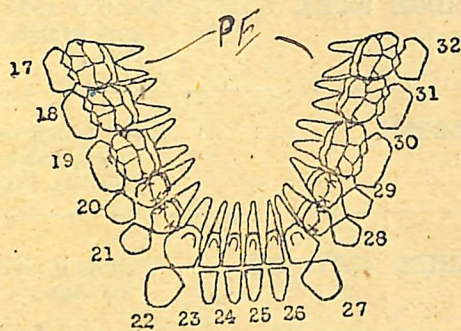


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

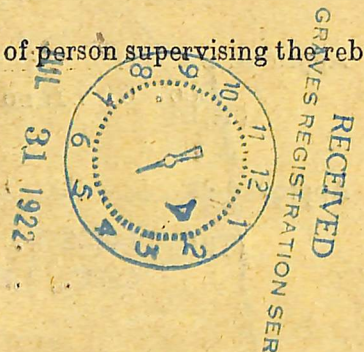

<p>FILLINGS.....Draw filling on tooth accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus :</p>	
<p>CARIES (CAVITIES).....Outline location and size of cavity, shade in thus :</p>	
<p>DENTURES (PLATES).....Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."</p>
