1. For reply direct to Mrs. Angiolina Pollutri, in Italy. Attention is invited to the decision of the Secretary of War, that no changes in requests would be accepted after August 15, 1921 and no original requests after April 1, 1922, which govern in this case.

2. The late Private Antonio Canosa, Co.L, 310th Infantry, gave as his emergency address, Mr. Ignazio Dippolito, (friend) 18 August St. Rochester, N.Y. His request was that the body remain in France. The widow's address was not available at the time the friend's directions were accepted and acted upon. This was in accordance with a decision of the Secretary of War, that "Where all efforts to locate relatives have proven fruitless, the person so designated in the emergency address has the right to direct disposition of remains."

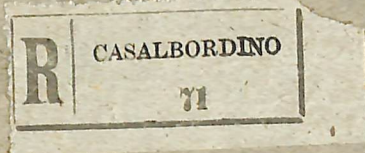

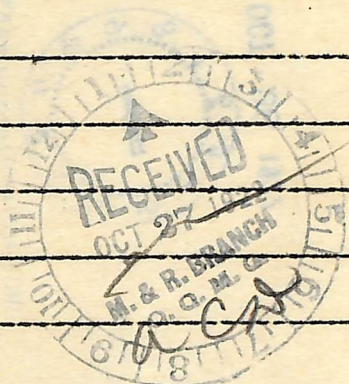

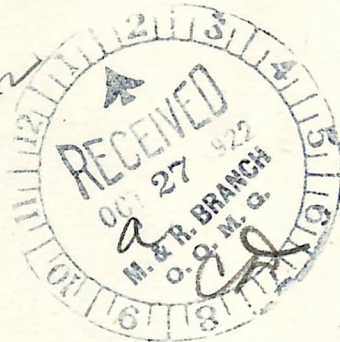

1. The permanent grave of this soldier is No. 21 Row 9 Block D, Meuse-Argonne American cemetery at Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France.
2. This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization and date of soldier's death. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.
3. In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

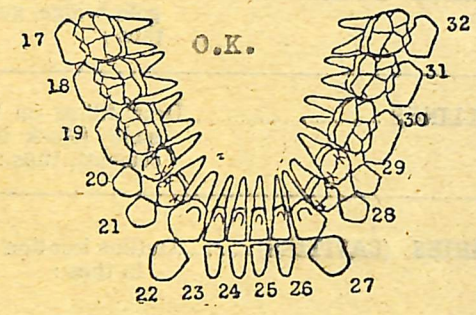
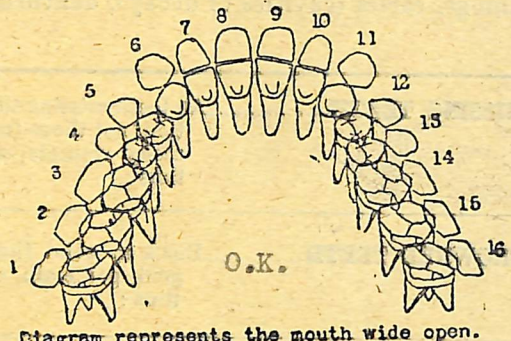

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

<p>DENTURES (PLATES).....Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."</p>
