Headstones.

1. Referring to the communication sent to you by Captain Chas. A. Morrow, Q.M.C. Graves Registration Service, Paris, relative to your desire to have an inscription consisting of nine lines in Italian cut on the headstone at the grave of your son the late Private Marino Capone, 1757813, Company F, 147th Inf., buried in France, you are advised that a design of headstone for the graves of World War veterans has been recently adopted, which will be of American white marble, 42 in. long, 4 in. thick, 13 in. wide throughout. Each stone is to have a circle 2-1/4 in. in diameter on the front face, near the top. An emblem of religious faith will be cut in each of these circles. These emblems will be either a Latin Cross, or the Star of David (six pointed star). The Star of David will be shown in the circle for soldiers of the Hebrew faith. The inscription to consist of the full name of the soldier with the state from which he came, his rank, regiment and division, also date of death to be cut on the face of the stone.

2. The above mentioned headstone with inscription as indicated will be furnished without expense to the relatives. However, the relatives will be permitted, at their own expense, to have placed on these headstones an inscription in the nature of a text or suitable quotation or term of endearment that they may desire providing that the number of letters do not exceed sixty letters.
