Dear Sir:-

The American Government is undertaking to remove the bodies of its soldiers who died in the late war to such places as the relatives may desire, and accordingly you are requested to advise whether you wish the body of your son, the late Private Domenico Caputo, Company B, 305th Inf., United States Army, to remain buried in France, in the care and custody of the United States, or delivered to you for reburial in Italy, or returned to the United States and placed in the National Cemetery at Arlington, Virginia, where the grave is assured constant care by the American Government. This Government bears all expense in connection with the transfer of the body.

Should you desire to have the body removed to Italy for reburial such transfer will be subject to the health regulations and sanitation laws of France and Italy, and should the operation of such instrumentalities prevent the removal of the body in the manner desired, it will remain in the care and custody of the American Graves Registration Service in Europe and will be cared for under the supervision of this Government.

Envelope for use in making reply is enclosed herewith.

The Department wishes to convey to you its assurance of sympathy in your bereavement.

On June 2, 1918, Pvt. Caputo was at grenade throwing practice with his platoon near Houille, Pas de Calais, on Rifle Range A. just as practice concluded, a trench mortar shell lying nearby exploded killing nine men outright and wounding severely many others. Pvt. Caputo was one of those killed outright. He died almost instantly.

He was buried same day in St-Omer, Pas de Calais.

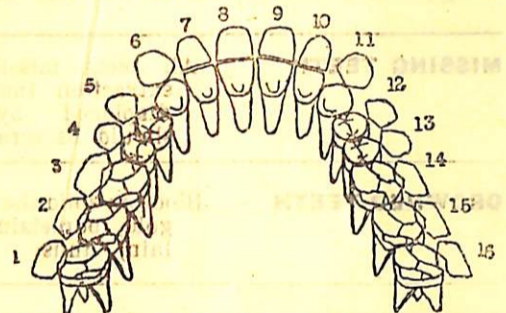
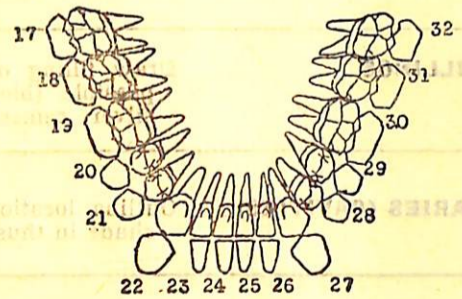


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

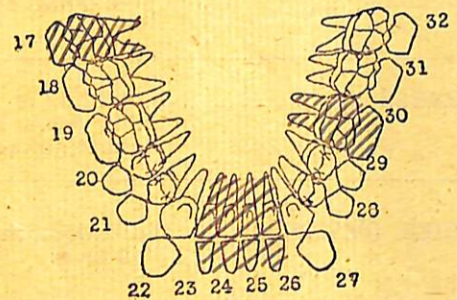
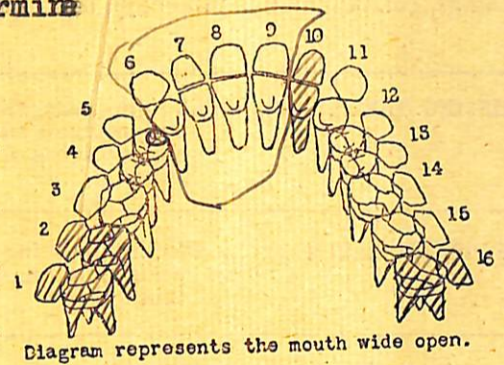
