The Board met pursuant to the foregoing order at 2.00: P.M. this date.

PRESENT : All the members except Major Henry C. Bierbower, M.C., on D.S. Lieut. Commander L.W. McGrath, U.S.N., was present as representative of the U.S. Naval Graves Registration Service.

The case of Private Nicola CARABILLO, Co.D. 59th Infantry, supposed to be buried in grave 93, Section A, Plot 2, Cemetery 1764, Belleau (Aisne) and whose body was not found, was investigated by the Board and the following documentary evidence considered; GRS Form 16-A, and Drawing showing relative position of graves in this row.

CONCLUSION : In grave 100, Section A, Plot 2, under the marker of Pvt. Mike Tedesco, Co.L. 59th Inf. body was found with corroded tag "10--" being legible, and collar ornament reading "U.S.59", This body was reburied as Unknown U.S. Soldier B.W.-39 due to the fact that Pvt. Tedesco was identified in grave 78, Section B, Plot 2, under the marker of Pvt. Arthur L. Lehman, Co.L. 59th Inf. Pvt. Lehman was identified in grave 97, Section A, Plot 2, under the marker of Pvt. Irvin C. Franklin, Co.D. 59th Inf. Pvt. Franklin was identified in grave 101, Section A, Plot 2, under the marker of Pvt. Steve Christian, Co.B. 59th Inf. Pvt. Christian was identified in grave 102, Section A, Plot 2, under the marker of Pvt. George Harry, Co.L. 59th Inf. Pvt. Harry was identified in grave 93, Section A, Plot 2, under the marker of Pvt. Nicola Carabillo, Co.D. 59th Inf. whose body was not found. It is possible that a transposition existed between these bodies in which case the body exhumed from grave 100, Section A, Plot 2, and reburied as Unknown U.S. Soldier B.W.-39 might be Pvt. Nicola Carabillo, Co.D. 59th Infantry.

RECOMMENDATION : The Board recommends that this case be referred to the Office of the Quartermaster General, Washington, D.C. for decision.
