

Your communication of April 17, 1930 addressed to the Veterans Bureau has been referred to this office for reply.

For your information there are enclosed copy of the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929 and copy of Pilgrimage Regulations relative to pilgrimage to cemeteries in Europe by mothers and widows of the military and naval forces of the United States who died during the World War and whose remains are now interred in such cemeteries.

You will note that the Act provides that an invitation shall be extended to the mothers and widows whose sons or husbands are interred in known graves in the American cemeteries in Europe, but it does not contain any provision which will permit of any member of the family other than the mother or unmarried widow making the pilgrimage. In this connection you are advised that no bill has been enacted into law to amend the provisions of the Act of March 2, 1929. You are therefore not eligible to make the pilgrimage to the grave of your brother, Sergeant Austin H. Carey, at the expense of the United States.





Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Both mothers and widows are entitled to make the pilgrimage.

Your attention is particularly invited to Section 4 of the enclosed Act, which defines the terms "mother" and "widow". If the relative is a stepmother, mother through adoption or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the decedent, a statement as to her relationship is requested. If he was survived by a widow who has since remarried it is also requested that a statement to that effect be made.






