Soldier Dead In France Cared For By Uncle Sam

All Graves Of Identified Men Tenderly Looked After, And Photographs Can Be Obtained By Relatives On Application—One Great Burying Ground Ultimately To Include Approximately 75,000 Fallen.

Washington, April 21.—This is an article intended for the mothers and fathers, the wives and sweethearts and the children of men of the army who died in France.

Few of them realize, perhaps, the marvelous tenderness with which this great army of ours is looking after its dead. Few know of the infinite and painstaking care with which the grave of each of these heroes has been sought for and located. Few mothers have been told that by writing to the proper military authorities they can obtain not only information as to where their sons lie buried, but photographs of the individual graves.

It is service such as this that has signalized our army from all others: that has made of it not only a tremendously efficient force in battle but a tremendously human organization.

74,564 Identified Americans Buried There.

There are 74,564 identified American dead buried in France, out of the total of 79,708 soldiers killed and missing. The graves that hold these 74,564 bodies are scattered through 2,000 cemeteries. Some of these cemeteries contain just a few American boys and some several thousand. Since the armistice was signed the work of classifying these graves has gone ahead with great speed and thoroughness. Today almost complete details are available. Taken together, they comprise a record of high achievement on the part of the Graves Registration Service of the Army and of the American Red Cross.

Major H. R. Lemly, of the registration service, explains that each soldier who went into battle wore two tags about his neck, containing his name, rank, organization and identification number. When the body was buried, one of these tags was left attached to the remains and the other was placed on the small cross erected at the head of the grave, or, in the case of dead Jewish soldiers, on a small wooden six-pointed star, similarly placed.

No Distinction After Death.

In addition, there have been inscribed on each cross or star the same identification marks that are on the tag, as a double precaution. The crosses and stars are the same for generals as for privates. It is the army's boast that after death there is no distinction as to rank, and the graves of the dead enlisted men have received the same care and attention as those of the high officers.

The relatives of every man buried

the soldier. It is questionable as to whether it is wise for relatives to insist on this. Owing to the scarcity of shipping, for one thing, and for sanitary reasons, for another, it will be several years before this can reasonably or safely be done. It must be remembered that besides the 75,000 Americans lying there, approximately 1,000,000 British and 2,000,000 French are buried in the same general vicinity of the battle fields, not to mention the millions of Germans and Austrians. Any wholesale disturbance of graves, the French Government feels, might lead to serious results from a sanitary standpoint.

Great Central Cemetery Planned.

For the American soldiers who are left in France the War Department plans ultimately a great central cemetery, to be known as America's field of honor. It will be located on the most beautiful site obtainable and all that nature and art can contribute will be availed of for its perfection. It is the hope of the army that individual American cities and States will not insist upon erecting monuments of varied and conflicting styles

on this field. Instead, the War Department will ask from Congress authority to erect on this field a single shaft, rivaling in beauty and grandeur the majestic shaft to Washington in this city and signifying the glory of America's great sacrifice to liberty.

To those seeking exact information concerning the graves of relatives it can be stated that the proper official to address is "The Commander, Graves Registration Service, American Postoffice 717, France." From this source can be obtained the details as to the location of the grave in each instance and a photograph taken by the Red Cross. Ultimately the graves registration service office at the War Department in Washington will have the same data available





