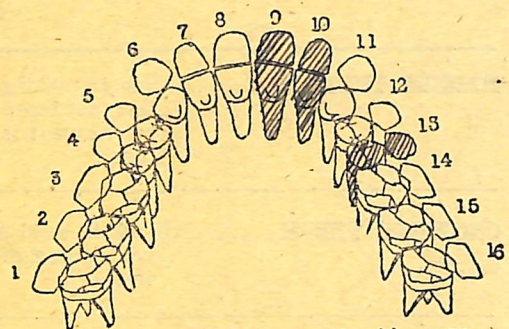
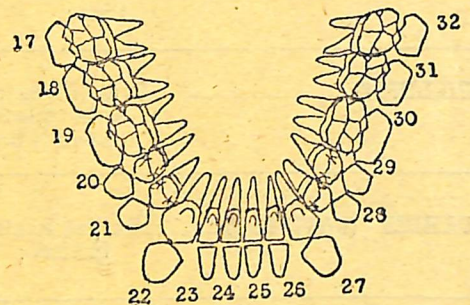


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial-number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".

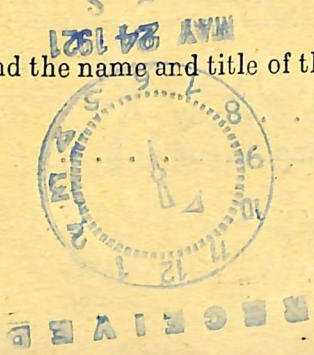
(b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? 6. Give all information as to body description and dental chart as nearly correctly as the condition of the body will allow. Items (e) and (f) under the body description are very important and should be very complete. The dental chart is also very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.

<p>MISSING TEETH.....All teeth missing through previous extraction (not those fractured or displaced by recent wounds) should be scratched out, thus :</p>	
<p>CROWNED TEETH.....Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold, porcelain, or gold and porcelain), thus :</p>	
<p>BRIDGE WORK.....Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold bridge, gold and porcelain bridge), thus :</p>	
<p>FILLINGS.....Draw filling on tooth accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus :</p>	
<p>CARIES (CAVITIES).....Outline location and size of cavity, shade in thus :</p>	

DENTURES (PLATES).....Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."

PRESENT : All members with the exception of Major R.P. Harbold, on D.S.

The case of Private Martino CARGUINO, 1999019 Company C, 119th Infantry, exhumed from Grave 2, Plot 3, Row B, Cemetery 77, Roisel (Somme), referred to the Board of Review due to the fact that reburial bottle and two metal strips found on remains read: "Pvt. V. Martino, Co.C, 106th Inf. #139019", was investigated by the Board and the following documentary evidence considered: GRS Form 16-A; GRS Form 114-A, and Drawing showing relative position of bodies in this row.


CONCLUSION : In Grave 2, Plot 3, Row B, Cemetery 77, Roisel (Somme) under the marker of Pvt. Martino Carguino, 1999019, Co. C. 119th Inf., body was found containing no means of identification except reburial bottle and two metal strips reading: "Pvt. V. Martino, Co.C. 106th Inf., #139019".


The Records on file, these headquarters, show that this body was originally buried in Grave 19, Row C, Plot 3, as Pvt. V. Martino, Co.C. 106th Inf., and was reburied in Grave 2, Row B, Plot 3, as Pvt. V. Martino, by the Field Forces previously effecting exhumations in this cemetery.

GRS Form 122 dated January 7, 1921, from the Office of the Quartermaster General, identifies this body as Pvt. Martino Carguino, 1999019, Co.C. 119th Inf., and directs that the inscription on the Cross and the records of these headquarters be changed accordingly.


In view of the foregoing, the Board concludes that identity in this case is positive.


