



The Quartermaster General desires that receipt be acknowledged of your letter of December 14th, 1923, addressed to Senator Charles Curtis, and forwarded to this office for consideration.

Please be informed that when the American Cemetery, Langres, Haute-Marne, France, was abandoned, your brother, the late Private Stanley B. Carlisle, Army Candidate School, 10th Company, was reburied, together with his many comrades, in the St. Mihiel American Cemetery, Thiaucourt, Meurthe-et-Moselle, France. The permanent grave location is #31, Row 20, Block B, St. Mihiel American Cemetery.

This American military cemetery is one of those to be maintained by the United States for all time in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of dignified design, with the name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. Headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

Please be assured that in effecting removal of the dead, the utmost reverential care was exercised and more than willingly accorded by those who performed this sacred duty. For the future, these graves will be perpetually maintained by the Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

There have been eight cemeteries designated by the Secretary of War for permanent retention. There are six in France, one in England and Belgium.

There is inclosed herewith a card which gives the permanent cemetery location of your brother's grave. This card is being transmitted to you as a memorial of his service to his country.




