Receipt is acknowledged of your communication of recent date furnishing information requested in connection with the pilgrimage authorized by the Act of March 2, 1929.

It is noted you state that your mother, Mrs. Carrie Erickson, was the adopted mother of the late Private Fred T. Carlson, Casual Company, 363rd Infantry, and that she wishes you to make the pilgrimage to his grave in her place. With reference to your mother's eligibility under the Act to make this pilgrimage, please be advised that the only condition under which she would be eligible would be by qualifying under the provisions of Section 4 (a) of the Act above referred to, which states in part, "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces".

It has been held that within the meaning of the law a person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult unless such adult is mentally or physically incapacitated. No man who was mentally or physically incapacitated was accepted for service in the military or naval forces. Inasmuch as Private Fred T. Carlson was an adult at the time of the commencement of his service, his age having been 27 years, 9 months, no person could have stood in loco parentis to him for the year prior to his entry into the service.

You are further advised that the Act of March 2, 1929 contains no provision which permits of the transfer of the invitation to make the pilgrimage to anyone. It is therefore regretted to advise that neither you nor your mother is eligible within the meaning of the law to make the pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.

The Quartermaster General desires you to be informed that the permanent grave of Private Fred T. Carlson, Casual Company, 365th Infantry, is Grave 24, Row 21, Block B, St. Mihiel American Cemetery, Thiaucourt, Meurthe-et-Moselle, France.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. Headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

You are assured in effecting removal of the remains, the utmost care and reverence were exercised and more than willingly accorded by those who performed this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

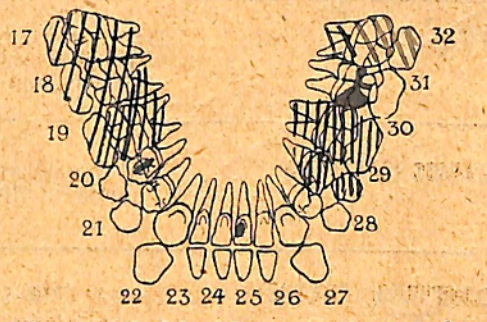
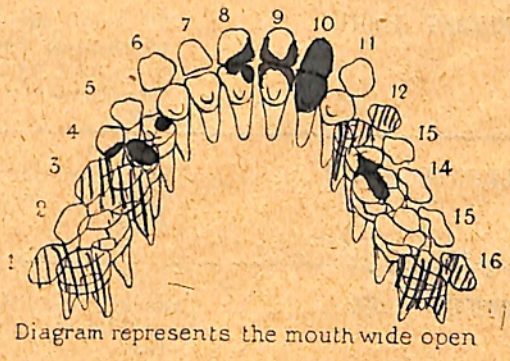

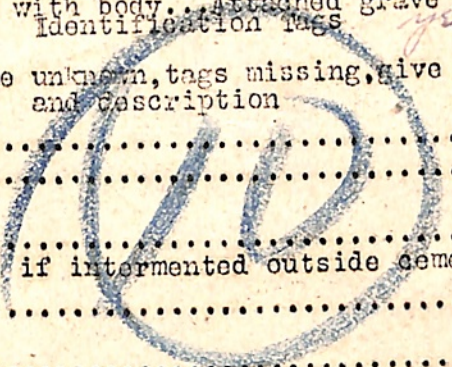
