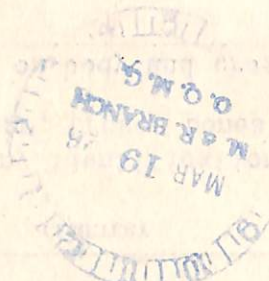

Catino Carnebucci was wounded while in pocket. S.E. of Binarville on October 3rd 1918, was evacuated on October 7/18 to Hospital. No record of him after he was sent to hospital.

Priv. Carnebucci was not killed on Oct. 5th 1918, but was wounded by a machine gun bullet in the right arm, and on october 8th 1918 when the Battalion was relieved from the pocket he was sent back to a hospital, but nothing was heard from him since.

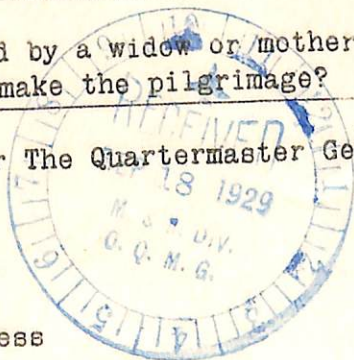

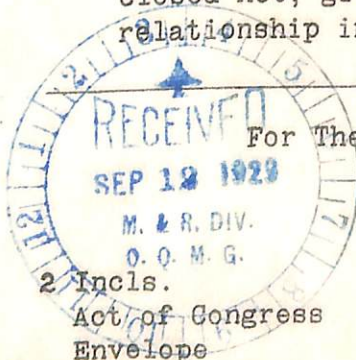

The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of the late Private 1/c Catino Carnebucci, Company C, 308th Infantry, is Grave 5, Row 12, Block B, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France. This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
