The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

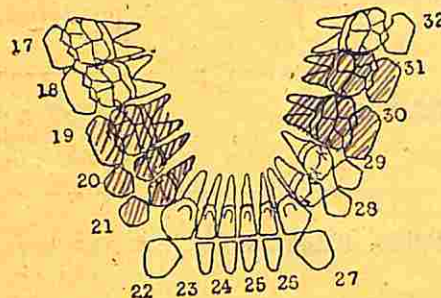
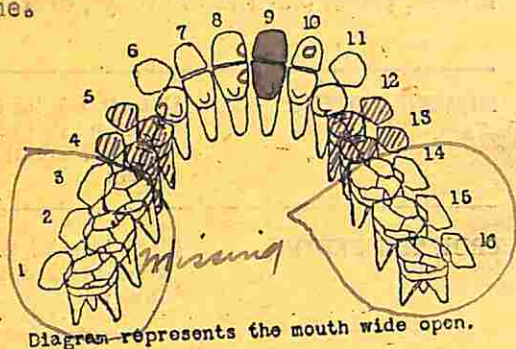
