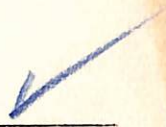

Your attention is particularly invited to the fact that this is the last opportunity you will have to make the pilgrimage under the provisions of the above mentioned Act. Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.

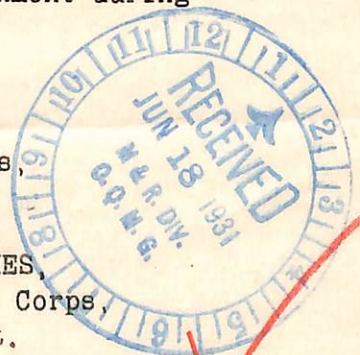

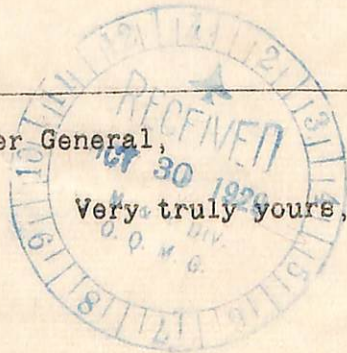

The Quartermaster General is pleased to inform you that the remains of your son, the late Private Frank P. Carr, Company E, 309th Infantry, have recently been recovered from an isolated grave in the Commune of Jaulny, Meurthe-et-Moselle, France, together with the remains of two of his comrades of Company E, 309th Infantry, and are being held in the mortuary of the St. Mihiel American Cemetery, Thiaucourt, Meurthe-et-Moselle, France, awaiting disposition advice from this office. Your son's identification tag and a catholic medal were found on the body and will be buried with it. No personal effects were found.

The records contain a request for the return of the remains to the United States for final interment. As some time has elapsed since this request was made, information is requested as to whether you still wish this action taken, or that the remains be permanently interred in one of the permanent American military cemeteries in Europe, where the grave will be reverently cared for by a grateful Nation as long as this Government endures. The overseas cemeteries have recently been beautified with trees, shrubs, lawns, walks, etc. to make them fitting resting places for the heroes sleeping there. Each grave will be marked with a permanent white marble headstone (crosses for the graves of those of the Christian faith and Stars of David for the graves of those of the Jewish faith) inscribed with the name of the soldier, his rank, regiment, division, date of death and State from which he came.

The Department does not wish to influence relatives in the disposition of their dead, but is honored when such relatives entrust their loved ones to its care. However, if on the other hand it is still your wish that the body be returned, this office will be pleased to comply with your request. All expenses incident to the return of the body to the United States and its shipment home will be borne by the War Department.

Any funeral expenses incurred after the body arrives at its destination, may be paid by the United States Veterans Bureau, Washington, D.C., in an amount not exceeding \$100. Information concerning reimbursement for funeral expenses may be obtained by writing to the United States Veterans Bureau.
