" Killed in action 10/31/18 CT 46 ."

" On the night of October 30th , my company had gone up to a position in a sunken road one kilometer north of Banteville . We were attached to the 2nd Bn. 360th Infantry , and we were in support waiting to relieve the Battalion holding the front line . Up to 1 A.M. it was quiet and there was not much shelling . After 1 o'clock the enemy commenced ~~shelling~~ shelling us heavily from three directions with 77's. My Platoon was dug in the bank of the road . Now and then a shell would go over our heads and burst on the opposite side the road . I was lying in a hole with Pvt. McLemore and we were rolled up in our blankets trying to sleep . 10 feet to the right and in another hole were Cpl. Carrague and Gunner McKee , but between the two fox holes were boxes containing 6000 rounds of ammunition . We dozed a little during the night and shortly after daylight , about 6.20 myself and Pvt. McLemore awoke and lit cigarettes . Cpl. Carrague and Gunner McKee were not smoking so they must have been sleeping . We had been smoking and talking for a few minutes when we heard a shell coming that sounded as if it would strike very close . We hugged the bank . I looked towards Cpl. Carrague and Gunner McKee just as the shell , an H.E. landed and I saw it make a direct hit in their hole . Both were blown to bits , which showered myself and Pvt. McLemore . The pile of ammunition was completely smashed up and it was the only thing that saved myself and Pvt. McLemore . "

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.




