July 19th \odot Arrived on the SS "American Merchant" at Cherbourg harbor at 12:30 A.M. in charge of Col. B.O. Davis as Liaison Officer and B.H. Seymour and Miss Ivez Neeley, nurses. The tender for the transportation of the pilgrims arrived alongside the ship at 6:45 A.M. with the following personnel connected with the Paris office: Major Francis M. Fitts, Captain Myron J. Conway, Capt. John P. Lake, Lt. Joseph S. Robinson, Lt. Brendan M. Greeley, 3 nurses and 1 civilian employee. Left Cherbourg at 8:11 a.m. for Paris and arrived at the Gare des Invalides at 2:13 P.M. where met by the Officer in Charge, members of his staff, nurses and runners. Went to the Hotel Splendid.

July 20th - Free in a.m. conference with conducting officer. In p.m. attended the ceremony at the Arc de Triomphe and tea and reception at the Restaurant Laurent.

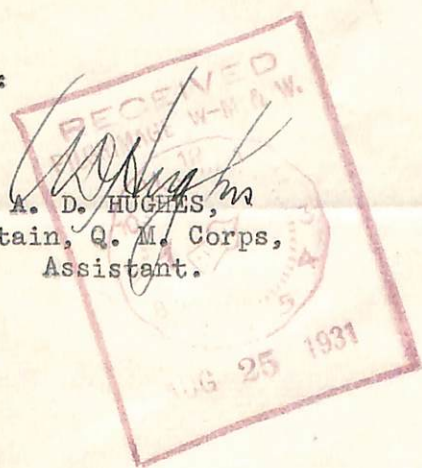

1. This Gold Star mother has now apparently returned to her home at the conclusion of her pilgrimage.

2. The Medical Department of the Army was not as such charged with responsibility for the medical care of the pilgrims during the course of their pilgrimage, and so far as known is not chargeable with their care afterwards. It would, in my judgment, be extremely unwise for the Army to undertake medical treatment of Gold Star mothers who have completed their pilgrimage. Any precedent for such treatment would not unlikely lead, in many instances, to life-long medical care, which certainly should not be assumed without full consideration and the express sanction of law.

SUBJECT: Injury to Mrs. Zelina Carrington, Party "K".

TO: The Quartermaster General,
Washington, D. C.

1. There is enclosed herewith copy of a letter to the Attending Surgeon, United States Army, Chicago, Ill., given to Mrs. Zelina Carrington, Colored Gold Star Mother of Party "K", who injured her right knee on July 18th, 1931, en route to Europe.

2. There is also enclosed copy of report of Colonel B. O. Davis with reference to this injury.

3. A radiograph of this injury was made at the Army Dispensary, New York City, on August 10th, 1931, and this shows a simple fracture, articulating surface, anterior, of tibia, and no apparent displacement. Calus, as much as can be expected in four weeks. This injury does not appear to cause this Pilgrim any particular trouble and it is not necessary to send a nurse home with her.

4. As this Pilgrim made inquiries as to what medical treatment she would receive in Chicago if she needed it and in order to obviate any claim for medical service, the action set forth above was taken by this office.

5. It is therefore requested that this action be confirmed, through The Surgeon General if necessary, in case this Pilgrim should report for further treatment to her injured knee.

July 18th: Mrs. Zelina Carrington injured her right knee (Contusion with effusion) in getting out of her berth. Investigation disclosed that Mrs. Carrington had used the upper berth in her Cabin. She had been advised by the Bed Room Steward, and the two nurses that she had been assigned a lower berth and should occupy it. I questioned Mrs. Carrington and she admitted that she had been told to use the lower berth, but that since nobody was using the upper berth and she preferred it, she used it.



My dear Col. Pope:

Concerning the case of Mrs. Zelina Carrington who fell from an upper berth on July 26th, 1931, while on board steamship "AMERICAN MERCHANT" I beg leave to state that I was not aware of her sleeping in an upper berth until the night of July 26th. My attention was called to her sleeping in an upper berth in an off handed way by some of the pilgrims while teasing each other about different happenings on the boat.

At this time I told Mrs. Carrington that no one was to use upper berths at which she replied that she preferred sleeping up because she rested better. It was early the following morning that while descending from the upper berth that Mrs. Carrington slipped and received an injury of the right knee.

Immediately notified the Surgeon on board the ship who responded and ordered treatment.

2. The Medical Department of the Army was not as such charged with responsibility for the medical care of the pilgrims during the course of their pilgrimage, and so far as known is not chargeable with their care afterwards. It would, in my judgment, be extremely unwise for the Army to undertake medical treatment of Gold Star mothers who have completed their pilgrimage. Any precedent for such treatment would not unlikely lead, in many instances, to life-long medical care, which certainly should not be assumed without full consideration and the express sanction of law.
