2. This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization and date of soldier's death. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

3. In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of July 19th in which you furnish information requested by this office relative to your brother, the late Private Michael J. Carroll.

It has been held that in order for a woman to be eligible to make a pilgrimage to the cemeteries of Europe under the loco parentis clause of the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended, she must have furnished the deceased member of the American forces with food, clothing, shelter, guidance, counsel, etc., thus taking the party off a father for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to the veteran's reaching the age of eighteen. The information submitted by you indicates that your brother lived with his father until he was twenty two years of age, and there is no data to show that your father was not considered the head of the house during that period. In view thereof, it is regretted to advise that you are not eligible within the meaning of the law to make a pilgrimage to your brother's grave in the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery in France at the expense of the Government.

The fact that you were of material assistance to your brother during the years of his immaturity is appreciated, but I am sure you will understand that the War Department has no alternative other than to administer the law as enacted by Congress.

Reference is made to correspondence forwarded you from this office relative to the pilgrimage of mothers and widows to the cemeteries of Europe, authorized by Congress in an Act approved March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930.

The only provision of law under which anyone other than the mother or widow of a deceased veteran could be considered for the privilege of making this pilgrimage is contained in section 4 (a) of the Act, as amended, which reads in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to the soldier, sailor, or marine becoming eighteen years of age."

It is possible that you may be eligible under this provision of the law to visit the grave of your brother, the late Private Michael J. Carroll. It is therefore requested that you furnish the following information, in order to assist this office in determining whether or not you may be eligible to make the trip.

How old was Private Carroll when he came to the United States?  
Did you provide him with food, clothing and shelter for five years prior to his reaching 18 years of age?

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of July 19th in which you furnish information requested by this office relative to your brother, the late Private Michael J. Carroll.

It has been held that in order for a woman to be eligible to make a pilgrimage to the cemeteries of Europe under the loco parentis clause of the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended, she must have furnished the deceased member of the American forces with food, clothing, shelter, guidance, counsel, etc., thus taking the part of a father for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to the veteran's reaching the age of eighteen. The information submitted by you indicates that your brother lived with his father until he was twenty two years of age, and there is no data to show that your father was not considered the head of the house during that period. In view thereof, it is regretted to advise that you are not eligible within the meaning of the law to make a pilgrimage to your brother's grave in the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery in France at the expense of the Government.

The fact that you were of material assistance to your brother during the years of his immaturity is appreciated, but I am sure you will understand that the War Department has no alternative other than to administer the law as enacted by Congress.
