PARTY "W" 1931 PILGRIMAGE

Sailed on the George Washington and arrived Cherbourg harbor at 12:30 P.M. August 6th. This party was in charge of Captain R. H. Darrell, Liaison Officer. The tender for the transportation of the pilgrims arrived alongside the ship at 12:52 and carried the following personnel from the Paris office: Captains Myron J. Conway, John P. Lake, Major Francis M. Pitts, Lieutenants William L. Barriger, Joseph S. Robinson, Brendan Greeley, James L. Grier, 4 nurses and 2 civilian employees. Left Cherbourg at 3:10 P.M. and arrived at the Gare des Invalides at 9:21 P.M. where met by Col. Ellis members of his staff, nurses and runners. Went to the hotel.

August 7th - A. M. free and conference with conducting officer. In the P.M. attended the ceremony at the Arc de Triomphe where a wreath was laid on the tomb of the Unknown Soldier - tea and reception at the Restaurant Laurent.

August 8th - Visited Sacre Coeur and Versailles

August 9th - Church or free and packed for the visit to the cemetery

August 10th - Left Paris at 7:15 A.M. for Verdun via Porte de Pantin, Montmirail, Chalons s/Marne. Arrived Verdun 5:45 P.M.

August 11th -12th -13th - Visited cemetery daily and sightseeing in vicinity.

August 14th - Left Verdun at 7:30 A.M. for Paris via St. Menchould, Suippes, Reims, Chateau-Thierry, Hill 204 and Montreuil. Arrived at Paris 7 PM

August 15th - Free

August 16th - Free or church - sightseeing

August 17th - Visited Notre Dame and Napoleon's tomb

August 18th - Shopping or free visited Louvre if so desired

August 19th - Visited Colonial Exposition and packed

August 20th - Left for Cherbourg to sail for the United States.

Upon your arrival in New York City, you will be met at the railroad station by an Army Officer who will be in uniform. During your sojourn in New York before sailing for Europe, and upon your return from Europe, you will stop at the hotel McAlpin, 34th Street and Broadway, New York City.

All mail intended to reach you between July 29th, 1931, the day you sail from the United States, and August 20th, 1931, the day you leave Europe, should be addressed to you in care of American Pilgrimage, 146 Avenue des Champs Elysees, Paris, France; for example:

In making reservations for your journey home from New York City, it is necessary for this office to furnish the railroads with the exact time and date of your departure. The party you are to travel with will be disbanded in New York City on the day following your return from Europe and all arrangements for your accommodations will be made with the railroads by this office accordingly. Upon your return from Europe, it will therefore be necessary for you to remain in the hotel over night as a guest of the United States Government.

There is also enclosed herewith information relative to the cemeteries in Europe.

You must have a passport to enter Europe. Please go at once to the Clerk of the United States District Court nearest your home or to the Clerk of the Court at your County seat. The following action must be taken by you now:

(a) Have four (4) photographs of yourself made on thin paper (unmounted) not more than 3 x 3 inches or less than 2½ x 2½ inches in size.

(b) Take these photographs, your invitation and any evidence of citizenship you may have to the Clerk of the Court as shown above.

(c) Have someone who has known you for at least two years go with you to the Clerk to identify you.

The Clerk will help you fill out the application and HE will forward it to the proper office. Passports will be delivered to you aboard the boat. No charge will be made for the application or passport.
