After finishing work men had gone into dugouts for night Casey had gone outside for some purpose when shell landed and tore his body to pieces. He was buried in wood where he was killed. 
Dear Sir:

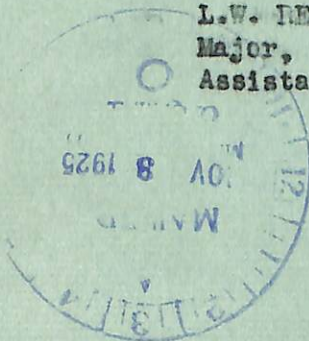

The graves will be permanently marked by white headstones inscribed with the name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. Headstones will be placed at all graves, as soon as possible, and without necessity for special action or request on the part of relatives.

Please be assured that in effecting removal of the dead, the utmost reverential care was exercised by those who performed this sacred duty. For the future, these graves will be perpetually maintained by the Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.
