



Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of recent date relative to the pilgrimage authorized by Congress in the Act of March 2, 1929.

In reply thereto, you are advised that the above mentioned Act provides that invitations for a pilgrimage shall be extended the mothers and widows of the members of the military or naval forces of the United States who are interred in the cemeteries in Europe, provided they have not made a previous visit thereto, but it does not contain any provision which permits of anyone else making the pilgrimage. It is therefore regretted to have to advise that you are not eligible under the law to make this pilgrimage.
