Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of July 29, 1929, relative to the Gold Star Mothers' and Widows' Pilgrimage authorized by the Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929.

It is assumed you request the privilege of making this pilgrimage to your grandson's grave under the provisions of Section 4 (a) of the Act which states in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces". In determining who is meant by the phrase "who stood in loco parentis", this phrase has been given its usually accepted legal meaning and it has been held that:

(a) A person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult who is not incapacitated either mentally or physically.

(b) In order for a woman to occupy such a status towards a minor or incapacitated adult, she must act the part of a lawful father of such person in performing the duty of providing for him, intending thereby to take the place of the father in this particular.

(c) In order to receive the benefits of the Act in question, she must have occupied the status toward a particular deceased member of the military or naval forces "for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces".

The records indicate that the late Private William M. Casey was 23 years of age when he entered the military service. As there is a positive showing that the soldier in question was not incapacitated either mentally or physically at the time of his entry into the military service and that he was more than 21 years of age, it is not possible for you to have stood in loco parentis to him within the meaning of the Act, for the year immediately preceding the commencement of his service in the Army. It is therefore regretted to advise that you are ineligible to make the pilgrimage to his grave.




If, however, you do not hear from him then I make this suggestion: That if the body must be disinterred in France for the purpose of being interred in a permanent cemetery, then, and in that event, I think it would be better, and I would prefer that the body be brought to the United States for re-interment rather than be re-interred in France. I write you this to save you the trouble of writing me again in the event you do not hear from his father.

Subject: Disposition of remains.

1. In reply to your letters of January 15th and 17th 1921, respectively, directing that the remains of your grandson, the late Private William M. Casey, Company K, 127th Infantry be permanently interred in France, instead of being returned to this country for private burial, you are advised that your wishes will be complied with, in the event the deceased is not survived by a widow, child, father, mother, brothers or sisters. It is, therefore, requested that you advise definitely whether or not such relatives survive and if so, that the name, or names, and address, or addresses, of each be furnished this office without delay.

2. In view of this information cancellation has not yet been made on the records of this office of your former request, pending receipt of the advice referred to above.

3. You are further advised that the remains of the deceased are now interred in Grave 702, American Cemetery, Mesves, Department of Nievre, which cemetery will not be permanently maintained by the Government. It is the policy of the Government to concentrate the remains of our soldier dead which are to be interred in France, in permanent American Cemeteries and your attention in this connection is invited to paragraph 9, of the enclosed Cemeterial Division Bulletin No. 10-F-W.


