About the 21 of March, 1918, there was an eperdemic of mumps in Co. "L" 127th Infantry. Sup Sgt Charpie commenced to have a slight swelling under the jaw. He thought nothing of it, although he complained that a pimple on the swelling was quite sore. He reported to the infirmary for treatment for mumps. When the doctors examined~~at~~ him they discovered that the trouble was anthrax and he was immediately removed to Base Hosp. # 6 at Bordeaux. He died ther on March 24th, 1918, and was buried in the Base Hosp # 6 cemetery. ~~Ma~~ Men of Co. "L" 127th Infantry were on the firing squad and Chaplain Stearns of the 127th Infantry read the services.



In reply you are advised that the Act of March 2, 1929, provides that an invitation for a pilgrimage shall be extended the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers who are buried in the American cemeteries in Europe, but it does not contain any provision which permits of any other member of the family making the pilgrimage in place of the mother where she is deceased and there is no widow.
