Report of death on Sgt. Chase was rendered by the Chaplain of the 90th Division. (Forwarded for particulars).

There is no one now with this company who was an eyewitness of the death of this soldier. His death occurred on October 9th, ~~1918~~ 1918, when he went into action on a line between the villages of Cunel and Romagne-sou-Montfaucon, in the Argonne. The company at noon occupied a position which, at 2 P.M., it was forced to alter. We were under heavy fire, of both M.Gs. and artillery, and several casualties occurred during the shifting of positions. Removal of the killed and wounded from our forward position was impossible, and the exact nature of this casualty could not be definitely determined. This soldier was therefore reported missing.

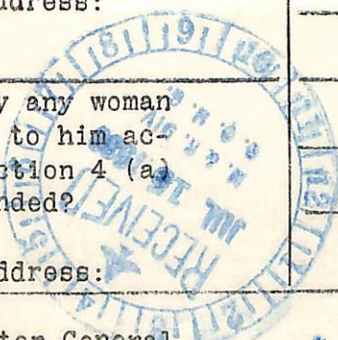

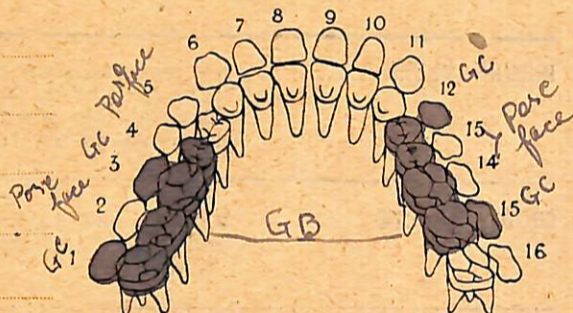
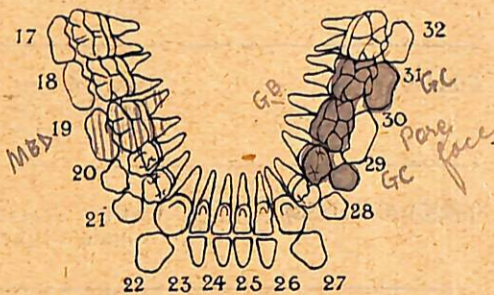


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

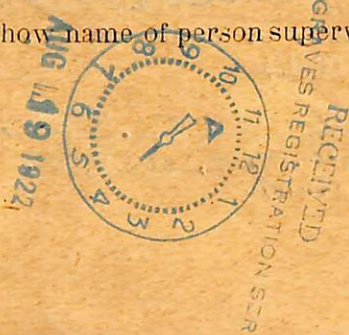
Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".
(b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. Give any and all information which it is thought might be of use in identifying the body, other than that tabulated under Item No 6.

Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.
