Dear Madam:

The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, authorizes pilgrimages to the cemeteries Of Europe during the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933 for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe.

Your attention is particularly invited to the fact that this is the last opportunity you will have to make the pilgrimage under the provisions of the above mentioned Act. Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.



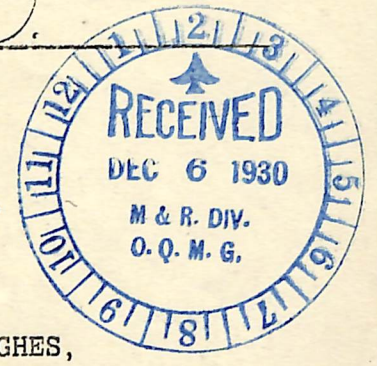



The purpose of the investigation is to determine the total number of mothers and widows entitled to make the pilgrimages, the number of such mothers and widows who desire to make the pilgrimages, the number who desire to make the pilgrimages during the calendar year 1930 and the probable cost of the pilgrimages to be made.

There is no sketch showing the burials in this vicinity. The GRS-form-1-a reports Lloyd Mapes Pvt 166 Inf. died 6-3-18 in grave # 1, Ira Spring, Co. F, 147 Inf, missing in action August 8th, ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~, and Unknown Corp. 147 Inf in Gr. # 3, died Aug 20th.

The Searchers report for Cheryy states that he was out on patrol ~~with~~ with other men and was led into German lines. His body was never found, this was about aug 19th.

The report for Spring states that they were out on patrol, the men were lost from the company for two days. He was either captured or killed.

The 147th Infantry lay in this immediate vicinity 'Baccarate Sector' From August 4th thru Sept 16th. The Casualty list has been checked, the other members who died or was killed in this Sector between Aug. 4, and Sept 16 all have burials.

Although there is no dental information available to check, there seems to be no doubt of the identity of this body.

The name "Cpl. Cherry Dean" appears on the list, but all the men I talked to about it said there was no such man in the Company and the number was Cpl. Cherry's.

Some time in August, Ickes was out on patrol with Sgt. Herbert Farmer, Pvt. Frank Brown, Cpl. Fred Cherry and others. They were in the charge of an American officer, but were working under the direction of a French Lieutenant, who asked for volunteers to go across NoMan's Land to see what was going on. Cherry went. The Frenchman arranged before they left that if he should fire one shot those who remained behind were to get ready to advance and if they fired two shots they were to rush the advance. After they had left the American officer said: "Boys, that sounds fishy to me. Let's deploy." They had no sooner do so than the place where they had been was raked by machine-gun fire. They then heard one shot fired and started forward, and heard Cherry shout: "O my God, Farmer, they got me." They went on but had to turn back, "on account of too many Germans." They found that the Frenchman must have been past the Germans when he fired. Lt. Boyle (who is now dead) and Farmer went over the next night to look for Cherry, but they didn't find him. "If he'd been killed they'd have found him."

(Pvt. Ickes is an intelligent man - he used to be a sergeant - with a good memory, and is evidently an accurate observer. He told this story with convincing vividness of detail and was corroborated in his memory of
